HOUSE BILL NO. 13

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 23-15-367, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT IN ALL ELECTIONS THE CANDIDATES' NAMES SHALL BE
- 3 ARRANGED ALPHABETICALLY ON THE BALLOT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 23-15-367, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 6 amended as follows:
- 7 23-15-367. Except as otherwise provided by Sections
- 8 23-15-974 through 23-15-985, * * * the order in which the titles
- 9 of the various offices shall be printed, and the size, print and
- 10 quality of paper of the official ballot is left to the discretion
- 11 of the officer charged with printing the official ballot * * *.
- 12 It is the duty of the Secretary of State, with the approval of the
- 13 Governor, to furnish the designated commissioner of each county a
- 14 sample of the official ballot, not less than fifty-five (55) days
- 15 <u>before</u> the election, the general form of which shall be followed
- 16 as nearly as practicable; provided that in all * * * elections the
- 17 names of the candidates for each separate office shall be arranged
- 18 alphabetically.
- 19 SECTION 2. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi
- 20 shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor,
- 21 or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the
- 22 Attorney General of the United States or to the United States
- 23 District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the
- 24 provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and
- 25 extended.
- 26 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from

- 27 and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting
- 28 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
