AN ACT TO CREATE WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC AND 1 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT A ONE-STOP INFORMATION CENTER TO PROVIDE A 2 3 ONE-STOP INFORMATION SYSTEM FOR FEDERAL AND STATE PROGRAMS 4 AVAILABLE FOR INDIVIDUALS AND SMALL AND MINORITY BUSINESSES; TO 5 REQUIRE SUCH ONE-STOP CENTER TO MAINTAIN A STATEWIDE REGISTER OF б CONTRACTS, PROGRAMS, LOANS AND GRANTS AVAILABLE; TO REQUIRE THE 7 COMPILATION AND DISTRIBUTION OF INFORMATION PACKETS; TO REQUIRE 8 THE COORDINATION OF AGENCIES; TO REQUIRE AN ANNUAL REPORT ON THE 9 ESTABLISHMENT AND ADMINISTRATION OF THE INFORMATION SYSTEM; AND 10 FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE 11 STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 12 13 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Department of Economic and Community 14 Development shall establish and administer a One-Stop Information Center to provide for the collection, summarization and 15 16 dissemination of information helpful to any person in establishing or operating a small or minority business, or seeking loans, 17 grants or other funds that may be available in this state. 18 19 (2) The One-Stop Information Center shall: (a) Collect, compile, summarize and disseminate 20 21 information packets to any person seeking a grant, loan or other incentive, and any information helpful to any person establishing 22 23 or operating a small or minority business; 24 (b) Maintain a statewide contracts register; 25 (c) Maintain a register of federal and state grants, 26 loans and other incentives available to assist individuals, and small and minority businesses; 27 28 (d) Provide information and help coordinate the 29 "one-stop permitting" available under Section 25-45-3 et seq.; 30 (e) In cooperation with existing state and federal 31 assistance programs, counsel on:

On January 2 of each year, beginning with January 2, 40 (3) 41 2000, the Department of Economic and Community Development shall make a written report to the Governor and the Legislature on the 42 43 implementation of this act. The report shall contain information 44 on: The establishment and administration of the 45 (a) One-Stop Information Center; 46 47 (b) The information available; 48 (C) How the information is disseminated; The number of persons who have used the One-Stop 49 (d) 50 Information System; The types of assistance that are available; 51 (e) 52 (f) The complaints and suggestions received by the department; and 53 54 (g) Plans and specific objectives to be accomplished by 55 the department in the next fiscal year. SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 56 57 and after July 1, 1999.
