## HOUSE BILL NO. 100 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 41-79-21, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 TO DELETE THE REQUIREMENT THAT THE THREE OCCASIONS OF A STUDENT 3 HAVING HEAD LICE NEED TO BE CONSECUTIVE OCCASIONS BEFORE THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT MAY PROVIDE ASSISTANCE ABOUT TREATING LICE; AND 5 FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 7 SECTION 1. Section 41-79-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 41-79-21. If a student in any public elementary or secondary 9 school has had head lice on three (3) \* \* \* occasions during one 10 (1) school year while attending school, or if the parent of the 11 student has been notified by school officials that the student has 12 13 had head lice on three (3) \* \* \* occasions in one (1) school year, as determined by the school nurse, public health nurse or a 14 physician, the principal or administrator shall notify the county 15 16 health department of the recurring problem of head lice with that student. The county health department then shall instruct the 17 child's parents or guardians on how to treat head lice, eliminate 18 head lice from household items, and prevent the recurrence of head 19 20 lice. The county health department shall charge the child's parents or quardians a fee to recover its costs of providing 21 treatment and counseling for the head lice. The school principal 22 or administrator shall not allow the child to attend school until 23
