HOUSE BILL NO. 176

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-17-8, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE AT LEAST ONE IN-SERVICE STAFF DEVELOPMENT WORKSHOP FOR 1 2 3 TEACHERS AND ADMINISTRATORS TO BE DEDICATED TO SENSITIVITY 4 TRAINING; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Section 37-17-8, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows: 37-17-8. (1) The State Board of Education, through the 8 Commission on School Accreditation, shall establish criteria for 9 10 comprehensive in-service staff development plans. These criteria shall: (a) include, but not be limited to, formula and guidelines 11 12 for allocating available state funds for in-service training to local school districts; (b) require that a portion of the plans be 13 devoted exclusively for the purpose of providing staff development 14 15 training for beginning teachers within that local school district and for no other purpose; * * * (c) require that a portion of the 16 17 school district's in-service training for administrators and teachers be dedicated to the application and utilization of 18 19 various disciplinary techniques; and (d) require that at least one 20 (1) of the school district's in-service staff development workshops for administrators and teachers be dedicated to 21 sensitivity training in order to prepare such persons to function 22 23 <u>effectively in a culturally diverse school environment</u>. The board 24 shall each year make recommendations to the Legislature concerning 25 the amount of funds which shall be appropriated for this purpose. 26 (2) Beginning with the 1998-1999 school year, school

districts shall not be required to submit staff development plans

to the Commission on School Accreditation for approval. However,

- 29 any school district accredited at Level 1 or Level 2 shall
- 30 include, as a part of any required corrective action plan,
- 31 provisions to address staff development in accordance with State
- 32 Board of Education requirements. All school districts, unless
- 33 specifically exempt from this section, must maintain on file staff
- 34 development plans as required under this section. The plan shall
- 35 have been prepared by a district committee appointed by the
- 36 district superintendent and consisting of teachers,
- 37 administrators, school board members, and lay people, and it shall
- 38 have been approved by the district superintendent.
- 39 (3) In order to insure that teachers are not overburdened
- 40 with paperwork and written reports, local school districts and
- 41 the State Board of Education shall take such steps as may be
- 42 necessary to further the reduction of paperwork requirements on
- 43 teachers.
- 44 (4) If any school district meets Level 4 or 5 accreditation
- 45 standards, the State Board of Education, in its discretion, may
- 46 exempt such school district from the provisions of this section.
- 47 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 48 and after July 1, 1999.
