6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
7	SECTION 1. Section 37-19-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
8	amended as follows:
9	37-19-7. (1) The allowance in the minimum education program
10	for teachers' salaries in each county and separate school district
11	shall be determined and paid in accordance with the scale for
12	teachers' salaries as provided in this subsection for the number
13	of teachers employed not in excess of the number of teacher units
14	allotted. For teachers holding the following types of licenses or
15	the equivalent as determined by the State Board of Education, and
16	the following number of years of teaching experience, the scale
17	shall be as follows:

29 30 It is the intent of the Legislature that any state funds made 31 available for salaries of licensed personnel in excess of the funds paid for such salaries for the 1986-1987 school year shall 32 33 be paid to licensed personnel pursuant to a personnel appraisal and compensation system implemented by the State Board of 34 The State Board of Education shall have the authority 35 Education. to adopt and amend rules and regulations as are necessary to 36 establish, administer and maintain the system. 37 38 All teachers employed on a full-time basis shall be paid a minimum salary in accordance with the above scale. - For teachers holding a Class A license, the minimum base pay
- 65 specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Four
- 66 Hundred Twenty-five Dollars (\$425.00) for each year of teaching
- 67 experience possessed by the person holding such license until such
- 68 person shall have twenty-one (21) years of teaching experience.
- The level of professional training of each teacher to be used

- 86 All such salary supplements and process reimbursement shall be
- 87 paid directly by the State Department of Education to the local
- 88 school district and shall be in addition to its minimum education
- 89 program allotments and not a part thereof in accordance with

- 96 SECTION 2. Section 37-19-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

- 98 37-19-21. In additional to other funds allowed in this
- 99 chapter, each school district shall be allotted Five Thousand Six
- 100 <u>Hundred Thirty-nine Dollars (\$5,639.00)</u> annually per teacher unit
- 101 for use in supportive services.

- 103 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 104 and after July 1, 1999.
