HOUSE BILL NO. 326

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-19-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 CREATE THE WORLD CLASS TEACHERS PROGRAM AND TO PRESCRIBE THE 3 COMPONENTS OF THE PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 37-19-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

7 37-19-7. (1) The allowance in the minimum education program for teachers' salaries in each county and separate school district 8 9 shall be determined and paid in accordance with the scale for teachers' salaries as provided in this subsection for the number 10 of teachers employed not in excess of the number of teacher units 11 12 allotted. For teachers holding the following types of licenses or 13 the equivalent as determined by the State Board of Education, and the following number of years of teaching experience, the scale 14 shall be as follows: 15

1999-2000 School Year 16 and School Years Thereafter 17 Less Than 25 Years of Teaching Experience 18 19 20 21 22 A..... 21,695.00 25 or More Years of Teaching Experience 23 24 AAAA..... \$25,445.00 25 26 AA..... 23,745.00 27 A..... 22,695.00

No. 326 99\HR40\R742 PAGE 1 28 It is the intent of the Legislature that any state funds made available for salaries of licensed personnel in excess of the 29 30 funds paid for such salaries for the 1986-1987 school year shall be paid to licensed personnel pursuant to a personnel appraisal 31 32 and compensation system implemented by the State Board of The State Board of Education shall have the authority 33 Education. 34 to adopt and amend rules and regulations as are necessary to establish, administer and maintain the system. 35

36 All teachers employed on a full-time basis shall be paid a 37 minimum salary in accordance with the above scale. However, no school district shall receive any funds under this section for any 38 39 school year during which the local supplement paid to any individual teacher shall have been reduced to a sum less than that 40 41 paid to that individual teacher for performing the same duties from local supplement during the immediately preceding school 42 43 The amount actually spent for the purposes of group health vear. 44 and/or life insurance shall be considered as a part of the aggregate amount of local supplement but shall not be considered 45 a part of the amount of individual local supplement. 46

For teachers holding a Class AAAA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Six Hundred Fifty-five Dollars (\$655.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

52 For teachers holding a Class AAA license, the minimum base 53 pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of 54 Five Hundred Ninety Dollars (\$590.00) for each year of teaching 55 experience possessed by the person holding such license until such 56 person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class AA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Five Hundred Twenty Dollars (\$520.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience. No. 3 99\HR40\R742 PAGE 2 62 For teachers holding a Class A license, the minimum base pay 63 specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Four 64 Hundred Twenty-five Dollars (\$425.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such 65 person shall have twenty-one (21) years of teaching experience. 66 The level of professional training of each teacher to be used 67 in establishing the salary allotment for the teachers for each 68 year shall be determined by the type of valid teacher's license 69 70 issued to those teachers on or before October 1 of the current 71 school year.

Prior to April 15 of any school year in which a teacher 72 (2) 73 meets the standard requirements, any licensed teacher who shall 74 have met the requirements and acquired a Master Teacher 75 certificate from the National Board for Professional Teaching 76 Standards and who is employed by a local school board or the State 77 Board of Education as a teacher and not as an administrator shall 78 receive a salary supplement in the amount of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00) in addition to any other compensation to which the 79 80 teacher may be entitled. The teacher shall be reimbursed one (1) time for the actual cost of completing the process of acquiring 81 82 the Master Teacher certificate, regardless of whether or not the process resulted in the award of the Master Teacher certificate. 83 84 All such salary supplements and process reimbursement shall be 85 paid directly by the State Department of Education to the local school district and shall be in addition to its minimum education 86 87 program allotments and not a part thereof in accordance with regulations promulgated by the State Board of Education, and 88 89 subject to appropriation by the Legislature. Local school districts shall not reduce the local supplement paid to any 90 teacher receiving such salary supplement, and the teacher shall 91 92 receive any local supplement to which teachers with similar training and experience are otherwise entitled. 93

97	(b) The World Class Teachers Program contains the

99	(i) A system for recruiting and screening

105	(c) In order to initiate the program, sufficient
106	funding shall be appropriated by the Legislature. Policies and
107	practices that define the relationship of the Mississippi World
108	<u>Class Teachers Program to the Mississippi Teacher Center shall be</u>
109	established.
110	(d) The purposes of the program are:
111	(i) To create an avenue for rewarding excellence
112	<u>in teaching;</u>
113	(ii) To establish a pool of master teachers who
114	can serve as mentors, supervising teachers, or in a variety of
115	<u>leadership roles;</u>
116	(iii) To positively influence programs of teacher
117	education as colleges strive to have their graduates gain National

119	(iv) To encourage master teachers to stay in the
