- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4
- 5 SECTION 1. (1) For the purposes of this section, the
- 6 following terms shall have the meanings ascribed in this
- 7 subsection unless the context otherwise requires:
- (a) "Certified railroad locomotive engineer" means a 8
- 9 person certified under Title 49 Code of Federal Regulations
- 10 Section 240 as a train service engineer, locomotive servicing
- engineer or student engineer. 11
- 12 (b) "Qualified railroad trainman" means a person who
- 13 has successfully completed a railroad carrier's training program
- and passed an examination on railroad operation rules. 14
- (2) Except when the life or property of any person is 15
- endangered, no person operating or controlling any railroad, as 16
- defined in Section 77-9-5, may allow the operation of any railroad 17
- train or locomotive in this state unless the railroad train or 18
- locomotive has a crew of at least two (2) individuals. One (1) of 19
- 20 the individuals shall be a certified railroad locomotive engineer.
- 21 The other individual shall be either a certified railroad
- locomotive engineer or a qualified railroad trainman. A certified 22
- railroad locomotive engineer shall operate the control of the 23
- locomotive at all times that the railroad train or locomotive is 24
- 25 in motion. The other crew member may dismount the railroad train
- 26 or locomotive when necessary to perform switching activities and

- 27 other duties in the course of his or her job.
- 28 (3) Subsection (2) of this section does not apply to the
- 29 extent that it is contrary to or inconsistent with a regulation or
- 30 order of the Federal Railroad Administration.
- 31 (4) Any person who violates subsection (2) of this section
- 32 may be fined not less than Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) nor more
- 33 than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for a first offense, not less
- 34 than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) nor more than Five Hundred
- 35 Dollars(\$500.00) for a second offense committed within three (3)
- 36 years, and not less than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) nor more
- 37 than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for a third offense
- 38 committed within three (3) years.
- 39 SECTION 2. Section 1 of this act shall be codified in
- 40 Chapter 9, Title 77, Mississippi Code of 1972.
