## HOUSE BILL NO. 338

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-3-519, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,
  TO AUTHORIZE MUNICIPAL LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS IN MUNICIPALITIES
  OF 1,750 INHABITANTS OR MORE TO USE RADAR ON ANY PUBLIC STREET,
  ROAD OR HIGHWAY WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

  BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 63-3-519, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 63-3-519. (1) It shall be unlawful for any person or peace
- 9 officer or law enforcement agency, except the Mississippi Highway
- 10 Safety Patrol, to purchase or use or allow to be used any type of
- 11 radar speed detection equipment upon any public street, road or
- 12 highway of this state. However, such equipment may be used:
- 13 <u>(a)</u> By municipal law enforcement officers within <u>an</u>
- 14 <u>incorporated</u> municipality having a population of <u>one thousand</u>
- 15 <u>seven hundred fifty (1,750)</u> or more upon the public streets <u>roads</u>
- or highways, including state or federally designated highways,
- 17 lying within the corporate limits of the municipality;
- 18 <u>(b)</u> By any college or university campus police force
- 19 within the confines of any campus wherein more than two thousand
- 20 (2,000) students are enrolled.

- 22 (2) The Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol may not use radar
- 23 on highways within municipalities with a population in excess of
- 24 one thousand seven hundred fifty (1,750) according to the latest
- 25 federal census.
- 26 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 27 and after July 1, 1999.
