7	SECTION 1. Section 63-3-519, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
8	amended as follows:
9	63-3-519. (1) It shall be unlawful for any person or peace
LO	officer or law enforcement agency, except the Mississippi Highway
L1	Safety Patrol, to purchase or use or allow to be used any type of
L2	radar speed detection equipment upon any public street, road or
L3	highway of this state. However, such equipment may be used:
L4	(a) By municipal law enforcement officers within a
L5	municipality having a population of two thousand (2,000) or more
L6	upon the public streets of the municipality;
L7	(b) By any college or university campus police force
L8	within the confines of any campus wherein more than two thousand
L9	(2,000) students are enrolled;
20	(c) By municipal law enforcement officers in any
21	municipality having a population in excess of fifteen thousand
22	(15,000) according to the latest federal census on federally
23	designated highways lying within the corporate limits; and
24	(d) By the sheriffs and deputy sheriffs of a county

26	including interstates and state or federally designated highways,
27	having a population of eighty thousand (80,000), or more according

- 30 (2) The Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol will not set up
- 31 radar on highways within municipalities with a population in
