AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 37-106-29 AND 37-106-31, MISSISSIPE	-29 AND 37-106-31, MISSISSIPPI

- 2 CODE OF 1972, TO REINSTATE THE RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT UNDER THE
- 3 MISSISSIPPI RESIDENT TUITION ASSISTANCE GRANT PROGRAM AND THE
- 4 MISSISSIPPI EMINENT SCHOLARS GRANT PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED
- 5 PURPOSES.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 37-106-29, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 8 amended as follows:
- 9 37-106-29. (1) There is established the Mississippi
- 10 Resident Tuition Assistance Grant Program for college or
- 11 university freshmen, sophomores, juniors and seniors to be
- 12 administered by the Mississippi Postsecondary Education Financial
- 13 Assistance Board established under Section 37-106-9, which shall
- 14 set the dates and deadlines for applying for an award under this
- 15 section. The board shall establish such rules and regulations as
- 16 it deems necessary and proper to carry out the purposes and intent
- 17 of this <u>section</u>.
- 18 (2) The college or university shall approve grants to
- 19 full-time freshmen, sophomore, junior and senior Mississippi
- 20 residents who meet the general requirements for student
- 21 eligibility as provided in subsection (4) of this section.
- 22 (3) Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grants shall be
- 23 for Mississippi students from any Mississippi family whose prior
- 24 year adjusted gross income (AGI) exceeds the maximum allowed to
- 25 qualify for full Pell Grant eligibility and campus-based federal
- 26 aid. Those Mississippi students receiving less than the full Pell
- 27 Grant award, as determined by the institution, shall receive a
- 28 Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant in an amount not to

29 exceed the maximum Pell Grant allowable for that individual
```

- 30 student. The award shall be applied to tuition, rooms and meals,
- 31 books, materials and fees not to exceed One Thousand Dollars
- 32 (\$1,000.00) for junior and senior students attending state
- 33 institutions of higher learning in Mississippi or four-year
- 34 regionally accredited, state-approved, nonprofit colleges and
- 35 universities in Mississippi, and Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00)
- 36 for freshmen and sophomores attending state institutions of higher
- 37 learning or public community or junior colleges in Mississippi, or
- 38 regionally accredited, state-approved, nonprofit two-year or
- 39 four-year colleges in Mississippi, which will be prorated per
- 40 term, semester or quarter of the academic year for costs of
- 41 attendance, calculated according to the formula specified in
- 42 subsection (8) of this section.
- 43 (4) The general requirements for initial eligibility of
- 44 students for Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grants
- 45 consist of the following:
- 46 (a) Member of a Mississippi family whose prior year
- 47 adjusted gross income (AGI) exceeds the maximum allowed to qualify
- 48 for Pell Grant eligibility and campus-based federal aid.
- 49 (b) Acceptance for enrollment at any state institution
- of higher learning or public community or junior college located
- 51 in Mississippi, or any regionally accredited, state-approved,
- 52 nonprofit four- or two-year college or university located in
- 53 Mississippi as listed in paragraph (d) of this subsection: (i) a
- 54 minimum grade point average of 2.5 calculated on a 4.0 scale after
- 55 seven (7) semesters, certified by the high school counselor or
- other authorized school official on the application, graduation
- 57 from high school verified by the institution before disbursement
- of award and has scored fifteen (15) on the American College Test
- 59 Program (ACT); or (ii) has attended a home education program
- 60 during grade levels 9 through 12, and has scored fifteen (15) on
- 61 the American College Testing Program; or (iii) satisfactory
- 62 completion of the General Educational Development Test (GED) or
- 63 have successfully completed the International Baccalaureate
- 64 Program and has scored fifteen (15) on the American College
- 65 Testing Program; * * * however, * * * any student entering a
- 66 vocational or technical program of study, or who has

- 67 satisfactorily completed the General Education Development Test
- 68 and attends a community or junior college will not be required to
- 69 have a test score under the American College Testing Program
- 70 except those students enrolled in courses of academic study. Any
- 71 student currently enrolled in any qualified institution shall have
- 72 to only meet the same requirements as students who are applying
- 73 for a renewal award.
- 74 (c) <u>Residence in Mississippi for no less than the four</u>
- 75 (4) years preceding the award of aid. Resident status for
- 76 purposes of receiving grants under this section shall be
- 77 determined in the same manner as resident status for tuition
- 78 purposes as set forth in Sections 37-103-1 through 37-103-29, with
- 79 the exception of <u>Section</u> 37-103-17.
- 80 (d) Must attend one of the following institutions of
- 81 higher learning: Alcorn State University, Delta State University,
- 82 Jackson State University, Mississippi State University,
- 83 Mississippi University for Women, Mississippi Valley State
- 84 University, University of Mississippi, University of Southern
- 85 Mississippi, Coahoma Community College, Copiah-Lincoln Community
- 86 College, East Central Community College, East Mississippi
- 87 Community College, Hinds Community College, Holmes Community
- 88 College, Itawamba Community College, Jones County Junior College,
- 89 Meridian Community College, Mississippi Delta Community College,
- 90 Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College, Northeast Mississippi
- 91 Community College, Northwest Mississippi Community College, Pearl
- 92 River Community College, Southwest Mississippi Community College,
- 93 Belhaven College, Blue Mountain College, Millsaps College,
- 94 Mississippi College, Rust College, Tougaloo College, William Carey
- 95 College, Mary Holmes College, Magnolia Bible College and Wood
- 96 College.
- 97 (5) By accepting a Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance
- 98 Grant, the student is attesting to the accuracy, completeness and
- 99 correctness of information provided to demonstrate the student's
- 100 eligibility. Falsification of such information shall result in

- 101 the denial of any pending grant and revocation of any award
- 102 currently held to the extent that no further payments shall be
- 103 made. Any student knowingly making false statements in order to
- 104 receive a grant shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable, upon
- 105 conviction thereof, by a fine of up to Ten Thousand Dollars
- 106 (\$10,000.00), a prison sentence of up to one (1) year in the
- 107 county jail, or both, and shall be required to return all
- 108 Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grants wrongfully
- 109 obtained.
- 110 (6) Eligibility for renewal of Mississippi Resident Tuition
- 111 Assistance Grants shall be evaluated at the end of each semester,
- 112 or term, of each academic year. As a condition for renewal, a
- 113 student shall:
- 114 (a) Make steady academic progress toward a certificate
- 115 or degree, as outlined in the school Satisfactory Academic
- 116 Progress Standards and certified by the institution's registrar.
- 117 (b) Maintain continuous enrollment for not less than
- 118 two (2) semesters or three (3) quarters in each successive
- 119 academic year, unless granted an exception for cause by the
- 120 administering agency; examples of cause may include student
- 121 participation in a cooperative program, internship program or
- 122 foreign study program. If a student fails to maintain continuous
- 123 enrollment, and is not granted an exception for cause by the
- 124 administering agency, the student is ineligible to receive the
- 125 Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant during the following
- 126 semester or trimester or term of the regular academic year.
- 127 (c) Have a cumulative grade point average of at least
- 128 2.50 calculated on a 4.0 scale at the end of each semester or
- 129 trimester or term.
- 130 (7) Each student, each year, must complete a Free
- 131 Application for Federal Student Aid form or a Statement of
- 132 Certification as designed by the administering board to determine
- 133 his <u>or</u> her eligibility for a Mississippi Resident Tuition
- 134 Assistance Grant.

- 135 (8) (a) The amount of the Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant awarded to any one (1) student, up to the maximum 136 137 amount provided in subsection (3) of this section, shall be the difference of the student's cost of attendance at his accredited 138 139 college of choice and the amount of federal aid such student may 140 receive, not to supplant but to supplement the amount of any federal aid awarded to the student. Cost of attendance is the 141 tuition and fees of the applicable institution plus an allowance 142
- (b) Payment of the Mississippi Resident Tuition

 145 Assistance Grant shall be made payable to the recipient and the

 146 educational institution and mailed directly to the institution, to

 147 be applied first to tuition.

- 148 (9) In order for an institution to remain eligible for its 149 students to participate in the Mississippi Resident Tuition 150 Assistance Grant Program, the institution shall comply with the 151 following requirements:
- 152 (a) A complete and accurate roster of the eligibility
 153 status of each awarded student shall be made to the board for each
 154 term, semester or quarter of the academic year the student
 155 receives a Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant.
- 156 The institution is required to make refunds to the 157 Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant Fund for any funds 158 which have not been disbursed to the recipient, in the case of students who have received a grant but who terminate enrollment 159 160 during the academic term, semester or quarter of the academic year 161 if an institution's refund policies permit a student to receive a refund in such instance. The recipient shall be responsible for 162 the refund of any funds which have been disbursed by the 163 164 institution in such instance.
- 165 (c) If a student drops below full-time status but does 166 not terminate all enrollment during the term, semester or quarter 167 of the academic year no refund will be required for that term.

- Resident Tuition Assistance Grant during the following term, semester or quarter of the regular academic year.
- 171 (d) The board may conduct its own annual audits of any
- 172 institution participating in the Mississippi Resident Tuition
- 173 Assistance Grant Program. The board may suspend or revoke an
- 174 institution's eligibility to receive future monies under the
- 175 program if it finds that the institution has not complied with the
- 176 provisions of this <u>section</u>. In determining a student's initial
- 177 eligibility, the number of prior semesters enrolled will not be
- 178 counted against the student.
- 179 (10) No student may receive a Mississippi Resident Tuition
- 180 Assistance Grant for more than the equivalent semesters or
- 181 quarters required to complete one (1) baccalaureate degree or one
- 182 (1) certificate or associate degree program per institution.
- 183 (11) Subject to the availability of funds specifically
- 184 appropriated therefor, it is the intent of the Legislature to
- 185 fully fund grant awards to eligible students. If funds are
- 186 insufficient to fully fund grant awards to eligible students,
- 187 grant awards shall be prorated among all eligible students. No
- 188 student shall receive any combination of student financial aid in
- 189 excess of the cost of attendance as defined in subsection (8)(a).
- 190 (12) No student receiving a Mississippi Eminent Scholars
- 191 Grant as provided in Section 37-106-31 shall be eligible to
- 192 receive the Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant pursuant
- 193 to this section * * * unless he is eligible for such award after
- 194 the Mississippi Eminent Scholars Grant has been considered by the
- 195 board when conducting an assessment of the financial resources
- 196 available to the student. In no case shall any student receive
- 197 any combination of student financial aid that would exceed the
- 198 cost of attendance, as defined in subsection (8)(a).
- 199 For purposes of this section, certificated shall mean, but
- 200 not be limited to, all postsecondary vocational programs in
- 201 eligible institutions as identified in subsection (4)(d) of this
- 202 section.

- 203 SECTION 2. Section 37-106-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 204 amended as follows: 205 37-106-31. (1) There is created a Mississippi Eminent Scholars Fund, to be administered by the Mississippi Postsecondary 206 207 Education Financial Assistance Board established under Section 37-106-9. The board shall set the date that will serve as the 208 deadline for applying for an award under this section and award 209 scholarships to each Mississippi student who: 210 211 (a) (i) Is recognized by the merit or achievement 212 programs of the National Merit Scholarship Corporation or the
- programs of the National Merit Scholarship Corporation or the
 National Achievement Scholarship as a semifinalist or finalist,
 and has obtained a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.5
 calculated on a 4.0 scale in high school subjects acceptable for
 credit toward a diploma, after seven (7) semesters certified by
 the high school counselor or other authorized school official on
 the application and graduation from high school verified by the
 institution before disbursement of award; or
- (ii) Has scored twenty-nine (29) on the American 220 221 College Testing Program or its equivalent and has obtained a 222 minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.5 calculated on a 4.0 223 scale after seven (7) semesters certified by the high school 224 counselor or other authorized school official on the application 225 and graduation from high school verified by the institution before 226 disbursement of award, or the equivalent in high school subjects acceptable for credit toward a diploma; or 227
- grade levels 9 through 12 and has scored twenty-nine (29) on the

 American College Testing Program or its equivalent; and

 (iv) Has been certified by the college or

 university to the Mississippi Postsecondary Education Financial

 Assistance Board as a Mississippi Eminent Scholar.

(iii) Has attended a home education program during

(b) Meets the general requirements for student eligibility, except as otherwise provided in this section.

- 237 military or public service assignments away from Mississippi when
- 238 such dependents live with such Mississippi residents and receive
- 239 high school diplomas from non-Mississippi schools shall be
- 240 exempted.
- 241 (d) Files an application for an award during his last
- 242 year in high school within established time limits.
- (e) Attends, on a full-time basis, any state
- 244 institution of higher learning or public community or junior
- 245 college, or any regionally accredited, state-approved, nonprofit
- 246 four- or two-year college or university located in the State of
- 247 Mississippi as listed in subsection (4)(d) of Section 37-106-29.
- 248 (f) Enrolls as a first-time-in-college student. Any
- 249 student who earns postsecondary academic credit prior to or during
- 250 the summer immediately subsequent to receiving a high school
- 251 diploma, who is dually enrolled in secondary and postsecondary
- 252 educational institutions, or who is enrolled in the early
- 253 admission program of a postsecondary institution shall be exempt
- 254 from this requirement.
- 255 (g) Is a resident of the State of Mississippi for no
- 256 <u>less than four (4) years preceding the award of aid</u>. Residency
- 257 status for purposes of receiving grants under this section shall
- 258 be determined in the same manner as resident status for tuition
- 259 purposes as set forth in Sections 37-103-1 through 37-103-29, with
- 260 the exception of $\underline{\text{Section}}$ 37-103-17.
- 261 (2) (a) Students who apply for awards no later than the
- 262 date set by the Mississippi Postsecondary Education Financial
- 263 Assistance Board as the deadline for applying for an award during
- 264 their last year in high school may later reapply to receive awards
- 265 during subsequent application periods when they do not accept
- 266 their initial awards. Similarly, students who receive initial
- 267 awards and who later do not accept renewal awards may reapply to
- 268 receive awards during subsequent application periods. Students
- 269 who apply under this paragraph must submit reinstatement
- 270 applications within three (3) years of filing their initial

- 271 applications. The institution shall accept reinstatement
- 272 applications according to dates set by the Mississippi
- 273 Postsecondary Education Financial Assistance Board and shall
- 274 determine the eligibility of such applicants in the same manner as
- 275 first-time applicants, except that students who apply pursuant to
- 276 this paragraph shall be required to have maintained the equivalent
- 277 of a 3.5 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale for all
- 278 college work attempted. The board shall not make awards to
- 279 reinstatement applicants who submit applications that are received
- 280 after the deadline set by the Mississippi Postsecondary Education
- 281 Financial Assistance Board.
- 282 (b) The board shall create a renewal application for
- 283 each student who received the award for one or more terms during
- 284 the immediately preceding academic year.
- 285 (3) (a) The annual award to a student shall be up to Two
- 286 Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) for tuition and fees.
- 287 Payment of the Mississippi Eminent Scholars Grant shall be made
- 288 payable to the recipient and the educational institution and
- 289 mailed directly to the institution, to be applied first to
- 290 tuition.
- (b) Within six (6) weeks of the end of regular
- 292 registration, inclusive of a drop-add period, institutions shall
- 293 certify to the board the eligibility status of each awarded
- 294 student. The eligibility status of each student to receive a
- 295 disbursement shall be determined by each institution as of this
- 296 date. Institutions shall not be required to reevaluate a
- 297 student's eligibility status after this date for purposes of
- 298 amending eligibility determinations previously made. However, an
- 299 institution shall be requested to make refunds for students who
- 300 receive award disbursements and terminate enrollment for any
- 301 reason during the academic term when an institution's refund
- 302 policies permit a student to receive a refund under the
- 303 circumstances.
- 304 (c) Institutions shall certify to the board the amount

of funds disbursed to each student and shall remit to the board any undisbursed advances within sixty (60) days of the end of regular registration.

- (4) A recipient shall maintain the equivalent of a 3.5 308 309 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale, or shall maintain 310 an approved equivalent student progress evaluation plan, on at least twelve (12) hours per quarter, trimester or semester in 311 312 order to be eligible for a continuation of the award. No student 313 may receive a Mississippi Eminent Scholars' Fund award for more 314 than the equivalent semesters or quarters required to complete one (1) degree or certificate program per institution. 315 The award may 316 be renewed annually upon certification of eligibility by the 317 eligible institutions that the recipient meets the necessary 318 qualifications. If any recipient transfers from one university, community college or junior college to another, his award will be 319 320 transferable, provided he is otherwise eligible for the award. 321 a student fails to maintain continuous enrollment, and is not granted an exception for cause by the administering agency, the 322 323 student is ineligible to receive the Mississippi Eminent Scholars 324 Grant during the following semester or trimester or term of the 325 regular academic year.
- 326 (5) The board may conduct its own annual audits of any
 327 institution participating in the Mississippi Eminent Scholars
 328 Grant Program. The board may suspend or revoke an institution's
 329 eligibility to receive future monies under the program if it finds
 330 that the institution has not complied with the provisions of this
 331 section.
- 332 (6) For purposes of this section, certificated shall mean, 333 but not be limited to, all postsecondary vocational programs in 334 eligible institutions as identified in subsection (4)(d) of 335 Section 37-106-29.
- 336 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
