(2) The provisions of subsection (1) of this section shall 10 apply to: 11 Any municipality, operating under a commission form 12 (a) 13 of government, and having a population of not less than fourteen thousand (14,000), according to the federal census of 1940; 14 (b) Any municipality, under whatever form of 15 government, having a population of not less than twenty-four 16 thousand (24,000), according to the federal census of 1940, and 17 situated in counties having a national military park; 18 (c) Any municipality, operating under the commission 19 20 form of government, and having a population of not less than ten 21 thousand five hundred (10,500) nor more than eleven thousand (11,000), according to the federal census of 1950; 22 (d) Any municipality, having an aldermanic commission 23 or city manager form of government, and having a population of not 24 less than three thousand eight hundred eighty-one (3,881) at the 25 1960 federal census, and situated on the Mississippi Gulf Coast; 26

bounded on one (1) side by the Mississippi River and being located
in a county having an assessed valuation in excess of Forty
Million Dollars (\$40,000,000.00) but less than Fifty Million
Dollars (\$50,000,000.00) and having a total population in excess
of thirty-seven thousand five hundred (37,500), according to the
latest federal census; * * *

(g) Any municipality having a population of more than ten thousand (10,000) according to the federal census of 1970, which is located within a Class 1 county in which U.S. Highway 51 and U.S. Highway 98 intersect and bounded on the south by the State of Louisiana<u>; and</u>
