HOUSE BILL NO. 404

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 69-19-5, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 REVISE THE DEFINITION OF TREE SURGERY WORK UNDER THE PROFESSIONAL 3 SERVICES LICENSING REQUIREMENTS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 69-19-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

7 69-19-5. Professional services are defined as follows: 8 (a) Entomological work. Receiving fees for advice or 9 prescriptions for the control or eradication of any insect pest or 10 rodent. Receiving fees for actual spraying, dusting, fumigating or any other methods used for the control or eradication of any 11 12 insect pest or rodent. When the majority of the income of an 13 operation, business or individual comes from the actual operation of a farm and the sale of crops therefrom and, as a service to 14 other farmers, these services are performed, such services shall 15 not be included in this definition. 16

(b) Plant pathological work. Receiving fees for advice or 17 prescriptions for the control or eradication of any plant disease. 18 Receiving fees for actual spraying or any other methods used for 19 20 the control or eradication of any plant disease. When the majority of the income of an operation, business or individual 21 comes from the actual operation of a farm and the sale of crops 22 therefrom and, as a service to other farmers, these services are 23 performed, such services shall not be included in this definition. 24 25 (c) Horticultural and floricultural work. Receiving fees for landscaping and setting of plants or for the sale of any 26

28 (d) Tree surgery work. Advertising in a local phone book,
29 newspaper, newsletter, bulletin or other prominently displayed
30 sign as a * * * tree surgeon and receiving compensation for any
31 work or consultation relative to the care, pruning, cabling,
32 bracing, topping, trimming, fertilizing, cavity work and removal
33 of ornamental trees and shrubs in any manner. * * *

(e) Weed control work. Receiving fees for advice or 34 35 prescriptions for the control or eradication of any weed. Receiving fees for actual spraying or other methods used for the 36 37 control or eradication of any plant which grows where not wanted. When the majority of the income of an operation, business or 38 individual comes from the actual operation of a farm and the sale 39 of crops therefrom and, as a service to other farmers, these 40 41 services are performed, such services shall not be included in 42 this definition.

(f) Soil classifying work. Receiving compensation for plotting the boundaries of soil and describing and evaluating the kinds of soil as to their behavior and response to management under various uses.

47 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 48 and after July 1, 1999.
