HOUSE BILL NO. 416

1	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-43-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO
2	PROVIDE THAT THE MISSISSIPPI COMMISSION ON WILDLIFE, FISHERIES AND
3	PARKS SHALL BE REQUIRED TO PRESENT ALL NEW REGULATIONS OR RULES OR
4	CHANGES TO RULES OR REGULATIONS TO CERTAIN LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEES;
5	TO AMEND SECTION 49-4-4, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, IN CONFORMITY
5	THERETO; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 8 SECTION 1. Section 25-43-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 9 amended as follows:
- 10 25-43-7. (1) Prior to the adoption, amendment or repeal of
- 11 any rule, the agency shall give at least thirty (30) days' notice
- 12 of its intended action. The notice shall include a statement of
- 13 either the terms or substance of the intended action or a
- 14 description of the subjects and issues involved, and the manner in
- 15 which interested persons may present their views thereon. The
- 16 notice shall be filed with the office of the Secretary of State
- 17 and mailed by the agency to all persons who have made timely
- 18 request of the agency for advance notice of its rule-making
- 19 proceedings. The Secretary of State shall furnish copies at the
- 20 request of any person and shall be reimbursed by the requesting
- 21 person for the expense of providing such service.
- 22 (2) <u>In accordance with the provisions of this chapter and in</u>
- 23 addition to the provisions of subsection (1) of this section,
- 24 before the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks may adopt,
- 25 <u>amend or repeal any of its rules or regulations, the commission</u>
- 26 <u>shall present all of the proposed new rules or regulations or the</u>
- 27 repeal or amendment of any rules or regulations to both the Game
- 28 and Fish Committee of the Mississippi House of Representatives and

- 29 the Wildlife and Fisheries Committee of the Mississippi Senate no
- 30 <u>later than thirty (30) days after the first day of the next</u>
- 31 <u>regular session of the Mississippi Legislature.</u>
- 32 (3) If an agency finds that an imminent peril to the public
- 33 health, safety or welfare requires adoption of a rule upon fewer
- 34 than thirty (30) days' notice and states in writing its reasons
- 35 for that finding, it may proceed without prior notice of hearing
- 36 or upon any abbreviated notice and hearing that it finds
- 37 practicable to adopt an emergency rule. The rule may be effective
- 38 for a period of not longer than one hundred twenty (120) days,
- 39 renewable once for a period not exceeding ninety (90) days, but
- 40 the adoption of an identical rule under subsection (1) of this
- 41 section is not precluded. Rules adopted pursuant to this
- 42 <u>subsection (3) by the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks</u>
- 43 shall be effective until thirty (30) days after the first day of
- 44 <u>the next regular session of the Mississippi Legislature.</u>
- 45 (4) No rule hereafter adopted is valid unless adopted in
- 46 substantial compliance with this section. A proceeding to contest
- 47 any rule on the ground of noncompliance with the procedural
- 48 requirements of this section must be commenced within one (1) year
- 49 from the effective date of the rule.
- 50 SECTION 2. Section 49-4-4, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 51 amended as follows:
- 52 49-4-4. (1) There is hereby created the Mississippi
- 53 Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks, to be composed of
- 54 five (5) persons appointed by the Governor, with the advice and
- 55 consent of the Senate, for a term of five (5) years. One (1)
- 56 person shall be appointed from each congressional district. The
- 57 initial terms of the members shall be one (1), two (2), three (3),
- 58 four (4) and five (5) years, respectively. Thereafter, all terms
- 59 shall be for five (5) years. An appointment to fill a vacancy
- 60 which arises for reasons other than by expiration of a term of
- office shall be made from the respective congressional district
- 62 for the unexpired term only. The members serving on the
- 63 predecessor Commission on Wildlife Conservation on June 30, 1989,
- 64 shall continue to serve as members of the successor Commission on
- 65 Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks until the expiration of the term of

- 66 their appointment to the predecessor commission.
- (2) The commission shall elect from its membership a
 chairman who shall preside over meetings and a vice chairman who
 shall preside in the absence of the chairman or when the chairman
- 70 shall be excused.
- 71 (3) The commission shall adopt rules and regulations
- 72 governing times and places for meetings and governing the manner
- 73 of conducting its business. Each member of the commission shall
- 74 take the oath prescribed by Section 268 of the Constitution, and
- 75 shall enter into bond in the amount of Thirty Thousand Dollars
- 76 (\$30,000.00) to be approved by the Secretary of State, conditioned
- 77 according to law, and payable to the State of Mississippi before
- 78 assuming the duties of office. Any member who shall not attend
- 79 three (3) consecutive regular meetings of the commission shall be
- 80 subject to removal by a majority vote of the commission members.
- 81 (4) The members of the commission shall receive no annual
- 82 salary but shall receive per diem compensation as authorized by
- 83 law for each day devoted to the discharge of official duties and
- 84 shall be entitled to reimbursement for all actual and necessary
- 85 expenses incurred in the discharge of their duties, including
- 86 mileage as authorized by law.
- The commission shall be composed of persons with extensive
- 88 knowledge of or practical experience in at least one (1) of the
- 89 matters of jurisdiction of the commission. In addition, one (1)
- 90 of the commissioners shall be knowledgeable and experienced in
- 91 marine fisheries management, and at least three (3) of the
- 92 commissioners shall be knowledgeable and experienced in the
- 93 management of game and freshwater fisheries.
- 94 (5) The commission shall have the power to adopt, amend and
- 95 repeal such regulations and rules, <u>in accordance with the</u>
- 96 provisions of Section 25-43-7, as may be necessary for the
- 97 operation of the department.
- 98 (6) The commission shall have the power and authority to

- 99 issue all licenses and permits under the jurisdiction of the 100 department.
- 101 (7) In the furtherance of its duties and responsibilities,
- 102 the commission may conduct hearings, gather testimony and perform
- 103 other functions required to carry out its powers and duties as
- 104 prescribed by statute.
- 105 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 106 and after July 1, 1999.
