HOUSE BILL NO. 493

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 27-19-56.5, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO DELETE THE REQUIREMENT FOR THE PAYMENT OF AN ADDITIONAL FEE FOR 3 THE ISSUANCE OF A DISTINCTIVE MOTOR VEHICLE LICENSE PLATE TO PEARL 4 HARBOR SURVIVORS AND PURPLE HEART MEDAL RECIPIENTS; AND FOR 5 RELATED PURPOSES.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 SECTION 1. Section 27-19-56.5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 amended as follows:

27-19-56.5. In recognition of the patriotic service rendered 9 by Mississippians who survived the attack on Pearl Harbor and by 10 Mississippians who are recipients of the Purple Heart Medal, any 11 such person is privileged to obtain one (1) distinctive motor 12 13 vehicle license plate or tag identifying him as a Pearl Harbor 14 survivor or a Purple Heart Medal recipient. The distinctive plates or tags shall be of a color and design designated by the 15 16 Tax Commission.

The distinctive license plates shall be prepared by the Tax 17 Commission and shall be issued through the tax collectors of the 18 counties in the same manner as are other motor vehicle license 19 plates or tags. An applicant for a distinctive license plate 20 21 issued under this section shall not be required to pay any fee or charge for the issuance of such license plate separate from or in 22 23 addition to the road and bridge privilege taxes, ad valorem taxes and registration fees otherwise required by law to be paid for the 24 issuance of a regular license plate for the vehicle. An applicant 25 for such distinctive plates shall present to the issuing official 26 27 either (a) written proof that the applicant is an honorably

discharged former member of one of the Armed Forces of the United 28 29 States and, while serving in the Armed Forces of the United 30 States, was present during the attack on the island of Oahu, Territory of Hawaii, on December 7, 1941, between the hours of 31 32 7:55 a.m. and 9:45 a.m., Hawaii time, or (b) written proof that 33 the applicant is a Purple Heart Medal recipient. The distinctive 34 license plates or tags so issued shall be used only upon a 35 personally or jointly owned private passenger vehicle (to include station wagons, recreational motor vehicles and pickup trucks) 36 37 registered in the name, or jointly in the name, of the person making application therefor, and when issued to such person shall 38 be used upon the vehicle for which issued in lieu of the standard 39 40 license plate or license tag normally issued for such vehicle.

The distinctive license plates shall not be transferable between motor vehicle owners; and in the event the owner of a vehicle bearing a distinctive plate shall sell, trade, exchange or otherwise dispose of the vehicle, such plate shall be retained by such owner and returned to the tax collector.

46 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 47 and after July 1, 1999.
