HOUSE BILL NO. 494

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 43-6-155, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,
2 TO PROVIDE THE SAME RIGHTS OF PUBLIC ACCESS TO TRAINERS OF SUPPORT
3 DOGS AS THOSE PROVIDED TO DISABLED PERSONS WITH SUPPORT DOGS; AND
4 FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

6 SECTION 1. Section 43-6-155, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
7 amended as follows:

8 43-6-155. (1) Any blind person, mobility impaired person or
9 hearing impaired person who uses a dog specifically trained as a
10 guide, leader, listener or for any other assistance necessary to
11 assist such blind, mobility impaired or hearing impaired person in
12 day-to-day activities shall be entitled to the full and equal
13 accommodations, advantages, facilities and privileges of all
14 public conveyances, hotels, lodging places, businesses open to the
15 public for the sale of any goods or services and all places of
16 public accommodation, amusement, or resort and other places to
17 which the general public is invited, and may take such dog into
18 such conveyances and places, subject only to the conditions and
19 limitations applicable to all persons not so accompanied, except
20 that:

21 (a) The dog shall not occupy a seat in any public
22 conveyance.

23 (b) The dog shall be upon a leash while using the
24 facilities of a common carrier.

25 (2) Trainers of support dogs shall have the same rights of
26 accommodations, advantages, facilities and privileges with support
27 dogs-in-training as those provided to blind, mobility impaired

28 and hearing impaired persons with support dogs under this section.

29 (3) No person shall deprive a blind, mobility impaired or
30 hearing impaired person support or a support dog trainer of any of
31 the advantages, facilities or privileges provided in this section,
32 nor charge such blind, mobility impaired or hearing impaired
33 person or support dog trainer a fee or charge for the use of the
34 dog.

35 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
36 and after July 1, 1999.
