HOUSE BILL NO. 500

1	AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO
2	ESTABLISH A SCHOOL VOUCHER PROGRAM; TO DEFINE CERTAIN TERMS
3	RELATING TO THE PROGRAM; TO PROVIDE THAT PARENTS SHALL RECEIVE
4	VOUCHERS FROM THE DEPARTMENT WHICH MAY BE USED FOR THE EDUCATIONAL
5	EXPENSES OF THEIR CHILDREN ATTENDING PARTICIPATING SCHOOLS; TO
6	PROVIDE THAT THE VALUE OF A VOUCHER SHALL NOT EXCEED \$3,350.00; TO
7	ESTABLISH A PROCESS FOR NONPUBLIC SCHOOLS TO BE CERTIFIED FOR
8	PARTICIPATION IN THE PROGRAM; TO ESTABLISH A PROCEDURE FOR THE
9	STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO REDEEM VOUCHERS SUBMITTED BY
10	SCHOOLS; TO REQUIRE CERTAIN INFORMATION TO BE REPORTED TO THE
11	DEPARTMENT BY PARTICIPATING SCHOOLS; TO AUTHORIZE THE STATE BOARD
12	OF EDUCATION TO ADOPT RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION
13	OF THE PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
15	SECTION 1. (1) The following words and phrases, as used in
16	this section, shall have the meanings ascribed in this subsection
17	unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

- (a) "Approved nonpublic school" means an elementary or 18
- 19 secondary school in the state which maintains educational
- standards equivalent to the standards establish by the State 20
- Department of Education for the state schools as outlined in the 21
- Approval Requirements of the State Board of Education for 22
- Nonpublic Schools and which is certified by the department as 23
- eligible to receive vouchers. 24
- 25 "Department" means the State Department of
- 26 Education.

- (c) "Eligible parent, guardian or custodian" means a 27
- person who is head of a household in which there is at least one 28
- (1) compulsory-school-age child. 29
- (d) "Voucher" means a document issued by the State 30
- Board of Education to an eligible parent, guardian or custodian of 31

32 a compulsory-school-age child which may be exchanged by a public

33 school or an approved nonpublic school with the board for money

34 for the educational expenses of the student attending that school.

35 (2) The State Department of Education shall establish and

36 implement a program under which an eligible parent, guardian or

37 custodian of each compulsory-school-age child in the state shall

38 receive from the department a voucher that may be used for

39 educational services at any public school or a participating

40 approved nonpublic school selected by the child's parent, guardian

41 or custodian. The parent, guardian or custodian to whom a voucher

is issued may use the voucher only if the child is admitted to a

43 public school or a participating approved nonpublic school. Upon

44 the child's admittance to the school, the parent, guardian or

45 custodian shall present the voucher to the school. The value of

46 the voucher shall be Three Thousand Three Hundred Fifty Dollars

(\$3,350.00) or, in the case of a nonpublic school, a sum equal to

48 the actual cost of tuition and fees annually charged by the

49 approved nonpublic school, whichever is less.

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50 (3) If an approved nonpublic school desires to be certified

51 by the department as eligible to participate in the voucher

52 program, the school shall apply to the department for

53 certification as a participating approved nonpublic school. The

54 department shall prepare and make available to approved nonpublic

55 schools a form for the application process. The department shall

56 conduct such investigation and inquiries as it deems necessary to

57 determine the qualifications of the approved nonpublic school to

58 be certified for participation in the voucher program.

59 Certification as a participating approved nonpublic school shall

60 be valid for each succeeding school year unless revoked by the

61 department or upon the request of the school.

62 (4) On behalf of each eligible parent, guardian or custodian

63 to whom a voucher is issued, the department shall pay to a school

64 a sum equal to the total value of all vouchers submitted by the

65 school to the department for redemption. The total annual payment

66 to which the school is entitled shall be made in periodic payments

67 throughout the year, at the same time and in the same manner state

68 funds are distributed to school districts by the department. Each

- 69 payment shall be in the same proportion to the total annual
- 70 payment to which the school is entitled as the portion of the
- 71 school year which the payment is intended to cover bears to the
- 72 total school year. The periodic payments may be adjusted by the
- 73 department as necessary to account for changes in the enrollment
- 74 of students in the school or other changes affecting the total
- 75 annual payment to which the school is entitled. The department
- 76 shall pay the remainder of the amount of the base student cost
- 77 funded by the state, if any, for each student participating in the
- 78 voucher program to the school district from which the student
- 79 transfers for the purpose of attending the school.
- 80 (5) The department shall require each school in which
- 81 students are admitted under the voucher program to provide to the
- 82 department a record of the students' enrollment and periodic
- 83 reports of the students' continued enrollment in and attendance at
- 84 the school. The department also shall require assurance from each
- 85 participating school that the school does not discriminate in the
- 86 admission of students on the basis of race, sex, disability, color
- 87 or economic status.
- 88 (6) The State Board of Education shall adopt such rules and
- 89 regulations that may be necessary in the implementation of this
- 90 section.
- 91 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 92 and after July 1, 1999.
