HOUSE BILL NO. 574

1 AN ACT TO REGULATE TOURIST-ORIENTED DIRECTIONAL SIGNS ON 2 CERTAIN RURAL ROAD; TO IMPOSE CERTAIN DUTIES UPON THE 3 TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. As used in this act: 6 (a) "Commission" means the Mississippi Transportation 7 Commission. "Department" means the Mississippi Department of 8 (b) 9 Transportation. 10 "Eligible attraction" means a tourist-oriented (C) activity that is all of the following: 11 (i) Within ten (10) miles of a rural road; 12 13 (ii) Not visible from the rural road; and (iii) No other outdoor advertising signs. 14 "Rural Road" means a road that is: 15 (d) (i) Not within the corporate limits; and 16 (ii) Not a controlled access facility, expressway 17 or freeway. 18 "Tourist-oriented activity" means a lawful 19 (e) 20 cultural, historical, recreational, educational or commercial (excluding fuel and food) activity for which a major portion of 21 the activity's income or visitors is derived during the normal 22 business season from motorists not residing within a twenty-five 23 (25) mile radius of the activity. 24 25 (f) "Tourist-oriented activity sign" means a sign used

to provide motorists with advanced notice of a tourist-oriented

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27 activity.

28 <u>SECTION 2.</u> The Mississippi Transportation Commission may 29 enter into a written contract with a nongovernmental entity to 30 manufacture, install and maintain signs under this act. The 31 nongovernmental entity shall be selected by the commission through 32 the competitive selection process. The written contract shall not 33 prohibit the nongovernmental entity from making a reasonable 34 profit, which shall be determined by the commission.

35 <u>SECTION 3.</u> The commission may impose a reasonable fee for 36 each tourist-oriented directional sign in order to reimburse the 37 department for anticipated costs in implementing and administering 38 this activity. Funds derived from this fee shall be deposited 39 into the State Highway Fund.

40 <u>SECTION 4.</u> The nongovernmental entity may impose a 41 reasonable fee upon each tourist-oriented directional sign for the 42 purpose of reimbursing the nongovernmental entity for anticipated 43 cost, including a reasonable profit, associated with 44 manufacturing, installing, maintaining and administering this 45 activity. All fees imposed by the nongovernmental entity must be 46 approved by the commission.

47 <u>SECTION 5.</u> The size, location, design and arrangement of 48 each tourist-oriented directional sign subject to this act shall 49 conform to the polices and procedures of the department and the 50 Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices.

51 <u>SECTION 6.</u> Qualified activities shall be required to remove 52 any advertising device that was unlawfully erected or that is not 53 in compliance with state or federal outdoor advertising laws, 54 regulation, policies or procedures.

55 <u>SECTION 7.</u> The commission shall adopt and promulgate rules 56 and regulations deemed necessary by the department to carry out 57 the requirements of this act.

58 <u>SECTION 8.</u> No state funds shall be used for the 59 manufacturing, installation, maintenance or administration of this

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61 SECTION 9. This act shall take effect and be in force from 62 and after its passage.

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
