1 2 3 4 5 6 7	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-19-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICTS AND PRIVATE ENTITIES TO PAY THE PROCESS COST FOR TEACHERS APPLYING FOR CERTIFICATION BY THE NATIONAL BOARD FOR PROFESSIONAL TEACHING STANDARDS AND TO BE REIMBURSED BY THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION FOR SUCH COST REGARDLESS OF THE SUCCESS OF THE APPLICANT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
9	SECTION 1. Section 37-19-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
10	amended as follows:
11	37-19-7. (1) The allowance in the minimum education program
12	for teachers' salaries in each county and separate school district
13	shall be determined and paid in accordance with the scale for
14	teachers' salaries as provided in this subsection for the number
15	of teachers employed not in excess of the number of teacher units
16	allotted. For teachers holding the following types of licenses or
17	the equivalent as determined by the State Board of Education, and
18	the following number of years of teaching experience, the scale
19	shall be as follows:

32	It is the intent of the Legislature that any state funds made
33	available for salaries of licensed personnel in excess of the
34	funds paid for such salaries for the 1986-1987 school year shall
35	be paid to licensed personnel pursuant to a personnel appraisal
36	and compensation system implemented by the State Board of
37	Education. The State Board of Education shall have the authority
38	to adopt and amend rules and regulations as are necessary to
39	establish, administer and maintain the system.
40	All teachers employed on a full-time basis shall be paid a
41	minimum salary in accordance with the above scale. However, no
42	school district shall receive any funds under this section for any
43	school year during which the local supplement paid to any
44	individual teacher shall have been reduced to a sum less than that
45	paid to that individual teacher for performing the same duties
46	from local supplement during the immediately preceding school
47	year. The amount actually spent for the purposes of group health
48	and/or life insurance shall be considered as a part of the
19	aggregate amount of local supplement but shall not be considered
50	a part of the amount of individual local supplement.
51	For teachers holding a Class AAAA license, the minimum base
52	pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of
53	Six Hundred Fifty-five Dollars (\$655.00) for each year of teaching
54	experience possessed by the person holding such license until such
55	person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.
56	For teachers holding a Class AAA license, the minimum base
57	pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of
58	Five Hundred Ninety Dollars (\$590.00) for each year of teaching
59	experience possessed by the person holding such license until such
50	person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.
51	For teachers holding a Class AA license, the minimum base pay
52	specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Five
53	Hundred Twenty Dollars (\$520.00) for each year of teaching
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    experience possessed by the person holding such license until such
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    person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.
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         For teachers holding a Class A license, the minimum base pay
    specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Four
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    Hundred Twenty-five Dollars ($425.00) for each year of teaching
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    experience possessed by the person holding such license until such
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    person shall have twenty-one (21) years of teaching experience.
         The level of professional training of each teacher to be used
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    in establishing the salary allotment for the teachers for each
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    year shall be determined by the type of valid teacher's license
    issued to those teachers on or before October 1 of the current
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    school year.
              Prior to April 15 of any school year in which a teacher
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    meets the standard requirements, any licensed teacher who shall
    have met the requirements and acquired a Master Teacher
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    certificate from the National Board for Professional Teaching
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    Standards and who is employed by a local school board or the State
    Board of Education as a teacher and not as an administrator shall
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    receive a salary supplement in the amount of Six Thousand Dollars
    ($6,000.00) in addition to any other compensation to which the
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    teacher may be entitled. The teacher shall be reimbursed one (1)
    time for the actual cost of completing the process of acquiring
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    the Master Teacher certificate, regardless of whether or not the
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    process resulted in the award of the Master Teacher certificate.
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    However, a local school district or any private entity may pay the
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    cost of completing the process of acquiring the Master Teacher
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    certificate for any teacher employed in the district, and the
    local school district shall be reimbursed such cost by the State
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    Department of Education, regardless of whether or not the process
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    resulted in the award of the Master Teacher certificate. If a
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    private entity has paid the cost of completing the process of
    acquiring the Master Teacher certificate for a teacher, the local
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    school district may agree to directly reimburse the entity for
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    such cost on behalf of the teacher. All such salary supplements
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- 98 and process reimbursement shall be paid directly by the State
- 99 Department of Education to the local school district and shall be
- 100 in addition to its minimum education program allotments and not a
- 101 part thereof in accordance with regulations promulgated by the
- 102 State Board of Education, and subject to appropriation by the
- 103 Legislature. Local school districts shall not reduce the local
- 104 supplement paid to any teacher receiving such salary supplement,
- 105 and the teacher shall receive any local supplement to which
- 106 teachers with similar training and experience are otherwise
- 107 entitled.
- 108 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 109 and after July 1, 1999.
