## HOUSE BILL NO. 718

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 49-4-4 AND 49-7-8, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE THE COMMISSION ON WILDLIFE, FISHERIES AND PARKS TO ENTER INTO A RECIPROCAL AGREEMENT WITH THE STATE OF ALABAMA ESTABLISHING RECIPROCITY AS TO THE USE OF RESIDENT FISHING LICENSES BY CITIZENS OF EACH STATE SIXTY-FIVE YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 8 SECTION 1. Section 49-4-4, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 9 amended as follows:
- 10 49-4-4. (1) There is hereby created the Mississippi
- 11 Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks, to be composed of
- 12 five (5) persons appointed by the Governor, with the advice and
- 13 consent of the Senate, for a term of five (5) years. One (1)
- 14 person shall be appointed from each congressional district. The
- initial terms of the members shall be one (1), two (2), three (3),
- 16 four (4) and five (5) years, respectively. Thereafter, all terms
- 17 shall be for five (5) years. An appointment to fill a vacancy
- 18 which arises for reasons other than by expiration of a term of
- 19 office shall be made from the respective congressional district
- 20 for the unexpired term only.
- 21 (2) The commission shall elect from its membership a
- 22 chairman who shall preside over meetings and a vice-chairman who
- 23 shall preside in the absence of the chairman or when the chairman
- 24 shall be excused.
- 25 (3) The commission shall adopt rules and regulations
- 26 governing times and places for meetings and governing the manner
- 27 of conducting its business. Each member of the commission shall
- 28 take the oath prescribed by Section 268 of the Constitution, and

29 shall enter into bond in the amount of Thirty Thousand Dollars

30 (\$30,000.00) to be approved by the Secretary of State, conditioned

- 31 according to law, and payable to the State of Mississippi before
- 32 assuming the duties of office. Any member who shall not attend
- 33 three (3) consecutive regular meetings of the commission shall be
- 34 subject to removal by a majority vote of the commission members.
- 35 (4) The members of the commission shall receive no annual
- 36 salary but shall receive per diem compensation as authorized by
- 37 law for each day devoted to the discharge of official duties and
- 38 shall be entitled to reimbursement for all actual and necessary
- 39 expenses incurred in the discharge of their duties, including
- 40 mileage as authorized by law.
- The commission shall be composed of persons with a
- 42 demonstrated history of involvement in at least one (1) of the
- 43 matters of jurisdiction of the commission and whose employment and
- 44 activities are not in conflict. All of the commissioners shall be
- 45 an active outdoorsman holding a resident hunting or fishing
- 46 license in at least five (5) of the ten (10) years preceding
- 47 appointment. A member shall not have a record of conviction of
- 48 violation of fish or game laws and regulations within five (5)
- 49 years preceding appointment or a record of any felony conviction.
- 50 (5) The commission shall have the power to adopt, amend and
- 51 repeal such regulations and rules as may be necessary for the
- 52 operation of the department.
- 53 (6) The commission shall have the power and authority to
- 54 issue all licenses and permits under the jurisdiction of the
- 55 department.
- 56 (7) In the furtherance of its duties and responsibilities,
- 57 the commission may conduct hearings, gather testimony and perform
- 58 other functions required to carry out its powers and duties as
- 59 prescribed by statute.
- 60 (8) The commission shall have all power for conserving,
- 61 managing and developing wildlife and fishery resources except for
- 62 saltwater aquatic life and marine resources under the jurisdiction
- 63 of the Mississippi Commission on Marine Resources.
- 64 (9) The commission may enter into a reciprocal agreement
- 65 with the State of Alabama exempting persons sixty-five (65) years

- of age or older from the requirement of obtaining a state fishing
- 67 <u>license</u>. The agreement shall provide that a citizen of either
- 68 Alabama or Mississippi who is sixty-five (65) years of age or
- 69 <u>older and who is authorized to fish in either Alabama or</u>
- 70 <u>Mississippi under each state's respective statutes or regulations</u>
- 71 <u>shall be entitled to fish in both states without obtaining a</u>
- 72 <u>fishing license</u>.
- 73 SECTION 2. Section 49-7-8, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 74 amended as follows:
- 75 49-7-8. (1) Except as provided in subsection (3) of this
- 76 <u>section</u>, a nonresident sixteen (16) years of age or older may not
- 77 hunt, fish, kill, take or trap any game animal, bird or fish
- 78 without having acquired and having in his immediate possession a
- 79 valid license issued by the Mississippi Commission on Wildlife,
- 80 Fisheries and Parks.
- 81 (2) The commission shall have the following duties and
- 82 powers:
- 83 (a) To prescribe the forms and types of nonresident
- 84 licenses that a nonresident must obtain;
- 85 (b) To determine the total number of each type of
- 86 nonresident license to be issued annually;
- 87 (c) To establish fees for nonresident licenses and the
- 88 collection fees for the agent issuing such licenses; provided,
- 89 however, that the fee for a nonresident all game hunting license
- 90 shall not be less than Sixty Dollars (\$60.00);
- 91 (d) To exercise all incidental powers necessary to
- 92 develop a nonresident licensing program.
- 93 (3) <u>A resident of the State of Alabama who is sixty-five</u>
- 94 (65) years of age or older is exempt from the requirement of
- 95 obtaining a license to fish in this state if the commission has
- 96 <u>entered into a reciprocal agreement with the State of Alabama as</u>
- 97 <u>authorized under Section 49-4-4.</u>
- 98 (4) A nonresident who violates this section or any licensing

- 99 regulation of the commission is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall
- 100 be punished as provided in Section 49-7-21(3).
- 101 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 102 and after July 1, 1999.
