- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 75-76-155, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 6 amended as follows:
- 7 75-76-155. (1) Except as otherwise provided herein, a
- 8 person under the age of twenty-one (21) years shall not:
- 9 (a) Play, be allowed to play, place wagers, or collect
- 10 winnings, whether personally or through an agent, from any gaming
- 11 authorized under this chapter.
- 12 (b) Be employed as a gaming employee, except that a
- 13 person who is eighteen (18) years of age or older and married may
- 14 <u>be a gaming employee</u>.
- 15 (2) Any licensee, employee, dealer or other person who
- 16 violates or permits the violation of any of the provisions of this
- 17 section, and any person under twenty-one (21) years of age who
- 18 violates any of the provisions of this section shall, upon
- 19 conviction, be punished by a fine of not more than One Thousand
- 20 Dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned in the county jail not more than
- 21 six (6) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
- 22 (3) In any prosecution or other proceeding for the violation
- 23 of any of the provisions of this section, it is no excuse for the
- 24 licensee, employee, dealer or other person to plead that he
- 25 believed the person to be twenty-one (21) years old or over.
- 26 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

27 and after July 1, 1999.
