HOUSE BILL NO. 755

AN ACT TO PROVIDE AN ALLOTMENT OF FUNDS UNDER THE MINIMUM
EDUCATION PROGRAM FOR THE PURPOSE OF EMPLOYING SCHOOL COUNSELORS
FOR GRADES K-8; TO PROVIDE AN ADDITIONAL ALLOTMENT OF FUNDS IN
EACH SUBSEQUENT FISCAL YEAR UNTIL EACH PRIMARY SCHOOL HAS EMPLOYED
AT LEAST ONE COUNSELOR; TO AUTHORIZE LOCAL SCHOOL BOARDS TO ASSIGN
SCHOOL COUNSELORS TO PARTICULAR SCHOOLS; TO AUTHORIZE THE STATE
DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO EMPLOY A SUPERVISOR OF COUNSELORS AND
TO ISSUE REGULATIONS REGARDING THE SERVICES OF SUCH COUNSELORS;
AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 11 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) Beginning with the 1999-2000 school year, in
- 12 addition to other funds allotted under the minimum education
- 13 program, each school district shall be allotted sufficient funding
- 14 to employ one (1) school counselor for stsudents in Kindergarten
- 15 through Grade 8, with funding for an additional school counselor
- 16 to be allotted per fiscal year until each primary school in the
- 17 school district has one (1) state-funded counselor. However,
- 18 until the time that there is a counselor in every primary school
- 19 at a counselor:student ratio of 1:500 or greater, the annual
- 20 appropriation for counselors shall not be reduced.
- 21 (2) The State Department of Education may increase the
- 22 number of positions funded each year beyond the above requirements
- 23 as money is made available.
- 24 (3) The assignment of the school counselors to the
- 25 particular schools shall be at the discretion of the local school
- 26 district with the following restrictions:
- 27 (a) The counselor:student ratio shall be no less than
- 28 1:500, or one (1) counselor per school building, whichever is
- 29 greater.

- 30 (b) No individual shall be employed as a school
- 31 counselor without appropriate training and certification as a
- 32 school counselor by the State Department of Education.
- 33 (4) To qualify for minimum program funding, school
- 34 counselors shall be full-time professional personnel, shall spend
- 35 at least seventy-five percent (75%) of work time in a direct
- 36 counseling relationship with pupils, and shall devote no more than
- 37 one-fourth (1/4) of the work day to administrative activities
- 38 which are counselor related.
- 39 (5) Nothing in this act shall prohibit any school district
- 40 from employing with local funds more school counselors than are
- 41 provided for in this act.
- 42 (6) The State Department of Education shall employ a
- 43 supervisor of counselors who holds certification as a school
- 44 counselor. The supervisor's responsibilities shall include the
- 45 oversight of the new primary school counseling programs as well as
- 46 existing secondary programs.
- 47 (7) The State Department of Education may adopt rules and
- 48 regulations regarding the activities of the school counselor, and
- 49 the school counselor is authorized to perform such services that
- 50 are not inconsistent with the rules and regulations.
- 51 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 52 and after July 1, 1999.
