No. 758 99\HR40\R1079SG PAGE 1 28 (b) The payment provided for under paragraph (a) of 29 this subsection shall be made to the beneficiary that was 30 designated in writing by the law enforcement officer, signed by the officer and delivered to the employer during the officer's 31 32 lifetime. If no such designation is made, then the payment shall be made to the officer's surviving child or children and spouse in 33 equal portions, and if there is no surviving child or spouse, then 34 to the officer's parent or parents. If a beneficiary is not 35 36 designated and there is no surviving child, spouse or parent, then 37 the payment shall be made to the officer's estate.

(b) The State Treasurer shall invest the monies of the trust fund in any of the investments authorized for the funds of the Public Employees' Retirement System under Section 25-11-121, and those investments shall be subject to the limitations prescribed by Section 25-11-121.
