HOUSE BILL NO. 767

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-3-43, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT JUSTICES OF THE SUPREME COURT AND JUDGES OF THE COURT OF APPEALS SHALL RECEIVE A DAILY EXPENSE ALLOWANCE IN THE SAME AMOUNT AS THE FEDERAL EXPENSE ALLOWANCE RATE, WHICH SHALL BE IN ADDITION TO THEIR REGULAR SALARY AND MILEAGE REIMBURSEMENT; TO AMEND SECTION 9-4-13, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, IN CONFORMITY THERETO; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- SECTION 1. Section 25-3-43, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 11 amended as follows:
- 12 25-3-43. (1) When any chancery judge, county judge or
- 13 circuit judge shall be required to travel in the performance of
- 14 his official duties, such judge shall receive as expenses of such
- 15 travel the mileage allowance and a reimbursement for other actual
- 16 and necessary expenses incurred in such travel as provided for
- 17 public officers and employees in Section 25-3-41, Mississippi Code
- 18 of 1972. This shall be the entire travel allowances or travel
- 19 expenses received by such judges.
- 20 (2) Chancery judges and circuit judges shall direct requests
- 21 for reimbursement for the travel expenses authorized pursuant to
- 22 this section to the Supreme Court and the Supreme Court shall
- 23 submit such requests to the Department of Finance and
- 24 Administration.
- 25 (3) The Supreme Court shall have the power to adopt rules
- 26 and regulations regarding the administration of travel expenses
- 27 authorized pursuant to this section.
- 28 (4) In any county in which is located a State Penitentiary,
- 29 the board of supervisors, in order to compensate the justice court

- 30 judges who are required to travel to the State Penitentiary, is
- 31 authorized to reimburse justice court judges' mileage in the
- 32 amount authorized by Section 25-3-41, but not to exceed One
- 33 Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per month, such monies to be paid from
- 34 the general county fund of such county.
- 35 (5) In addition to the regular salary provided by Section
- 36 <u>25-3-35</u> and the mileage reimbursement provided by Section 25-3-41,
- 37 <u>each Supreme Court justice and each judge of the Court of Appeals</u>
- 38 <u>shall receive an expense allowance as specified in this</u>
- 39 <u>subsection</u>. The expense allowance shall be equal to the maximum
- 40 <u>daily expense rate allowable to employees of the federal</u>
- 41 government for travel in the high rate geographical area of
- 42 <u>Jackson, Mississippi, as may be established by federal</u>
- 43 regulations, per day, for each day while attending to judicial
- 44 duties, up to a maximum of twenty (20) days per month.
- 45 SECTION 2. Section 9-4-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 46 amended as follows:
- 47 9-4-13. (1) The judges of the Court of Appeals shall
- 48 receive salaries as provided for in Section 25-3-35, shall be
- 49 reimbursed for <u>mileage</u> expenses incurred in performing their
- 50 duties at the rate authorized by law for public officials and
- 51 employees as provided for in Section 25-3-41, and shall receive an
- 52 <u>expense allowance as provided for in Section 25-3-43</u>.
- 53 (2) Staff attorneys, law clerks and all other employees of
- 54 the Court of Appeals shall be of the same grade classification as
- 55 Supreme Court employees performing the same or similar duties.
- SECTION 3. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi
- 57 shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor,
- or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the
- 59 Attorney General of the United States or to the United States
- 60 District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the
- 61 provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and
- 62 extended. SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force
- 63 from and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the
- 64 Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
