HOUSE BILL NO. 781

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 11-3-23, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 AUTHORIZE THE COURT OF APPEALS TO ASSESS A PENALTY IN CASES 3 FINALIZED BY THE COURT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. Section 11-3-23, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 amended as follows: 7 11-3-23. In case the judgment or decree of the court below be affirmed, or the appellant fails to prosecute his appeal to 8 9 effect, the Supreme Court or the Court of Appeals shall render judgment against the appellant for damages, at the rate of fifteen 10 percent (15%), as follows: If the judgment or decree affirmed be 11 12 for a sum of money, the damages shall be upon such sum. If the 13 judgment or decree be for the possession of real or personal property, the damages shall be assessed on the value of the 14 property. If the judgment or decree be for the dissolution of an 15 injunction or other restraining process at law or in chancery, the 16 damages shall be computed on the amount due the appellee which was 17 enjoined or restrained. If the judgment or decree be for the 18 dissolution of an injunction or other restraining process as to 19 20 certain property, real or personal, or a certain interest in property, or be a judgment or decree for the sale of property, or 21 22 some interest in it, to satisfy a sum out of the proceeds of sale, or to enforce or establish a lien or charge or claim upon or some 23 24 interest in property, and the only matter complained of on the 25 appeal is the decree as to some particular property or claim on 26 it, the damages shall be computed on the value of the property or

- 27 the interest in it, if the value of the property or interest in it
- 28 be less than the judgment or decree against it; but if the value
- 29 of the property or interest in it be greater than the amount of
- 30 the judgment or decree against it, the damages shall be upon the
- 31 amount of the judgment or decree; provided, however, the above
- 32 penalty shall not be assessed against any condemnee appealing from
- 33 a special court of eminent domain in any circumstances.
- 34 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 35 and after July 1, 1999.
