HOUSE BILL NO. 810

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 9-5-7 AND 9-7-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF
- 2 1972, TO REVISE THE METHOD OF ELECTING JUDGES FOR THE FIRST
- 3 CHANCERY COURT DISTRICT AND THE FIRST CIRCUIT COURT DISTRICT; AND
- 4 FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 9-5-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 9-5-7. There shall be three (3) chancellors for the First
- 9 Chancery Court District. For the purpose of appointment and
- 10 <u>election</u>, the three (3) chancellors shall be separate and distinct
- 11 and denominated for purposes of appointment and election only as
- 12 <u>"Place One," Place Two" and "Place Three."</u>
- 13 SECTION 2. Section 9-7-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 14 amended as follows:
- 15 9-7-7. There shall be three (3) judges for the First Circuit
- 16 Court District. For the purpose of appointment and election, the
- 17 three (3) judges shall be separate and distinct and denominated
- 18 for purposes of appointment and election only as "Place One,"
- 19 "Place Two" and "Place Three."
- 20 SECTION 3. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi
- 21 shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor,
- 22 or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the

- 23 Attorney General of the United States or to the United States
- 24 District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the
- 25 provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and
- 26 extended.
- 27 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 28 and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting
- 29 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
