- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 37-1-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 37-1-3. (1) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules 8
- and regulations and set standards and policies for the 9
- 10 organization, operation, management, planning, budgeting and
- programs of the State Department of Education. 11
- (a) The board is directed to identify all functions of 12
- 13 the department that contribute to or comprise a part of the state
- system of educational accountability and to establish and maintain 14
- 15 within the department the necessary organizational structure,
- policies and procedures for effectively coordinating such 16
- 17 functions. Such policies and procedures shall clearly fix and
- delineate responsibilities for various aspects of the system and 18
- 19 for overall coordination of the total system and its effective
- 20 management.
- (b) The board shall establish and maintain a system-wide 21
- 22 plan of performance, policy and directions of public education not
- otherwise provided for. 23
- 24 (c) The board shall effectively use the personnel and
- 25 resources of the department to enhance technical assistance to
- 26 school districts in instruction and management therein.
- 27 (d) The board shall establish and maintain a central

29	(e) The board shall establish and maintain within the			
30	State Department of Education a central management capacity under			
31	the direction of the State Superintendent of <u>Public</u> Education.			
32	(f) The board, with recommendations from the			
33	superintendent, shall design and maintain a five-year plan and			
34	program for educational improvement that shall set forth			
35	objectives for system performance and development and be the basis			
36	for budget requests and legislative initiatives.			
37	(2) (a) The State Board of Education shall adopt and			
38	maintain a curriculum and a course of study to be used in the			
39	public schools that is designed to prepare the state's children			
40	and youth to be productive, informed, creative citizens, workers			
41	and leaders, and it shall regulate all matters arising in the			
42	practical administration of the school system not otherwise			
43	provided for.			
44	(b) Before the 1999-2000 school year, the State Board			
45	of Education shall develop personal living and finances objectives			
46	that focus on money management skills for individuals and families			
47	for courses required in the eleventh or twelfth grade. The			
48	objectives must require the teaching of those skills necessary to			
49	handle personal business and finances and must include instruction			
50	in the following:			
51	(i) Opening a bank account and assessing the			
52	quality of a bank's services;			
53	(ii) Balancing a check book;			
54	(iii) Managing debt, including retail and credit			
55	<pre>card debt;</pre>			
56	(iv) Completing a loan application;			
57	(v) The implications of an inheritance;			
58	(vi) The basics of personal insurance policies;			

(vii) Consumer rights and responsibilities;

(viii) Dealing with salesmen and merchants;

57	<u>(3) The</u>	State Board of Education shall through its actions
