(1) A person is guilty of burglary/home invasion 6 7 if the person enters a dwelling without consent and with intent to commit a crime in the dwelling, and when, in effecting entry or 8 while in the dwelling or in immediate flight, he or another 9 10 participant in the crime: Is armed with a deadly weapon or explosive; or 11 (a) 12 (b) Causes physical injury to a person who is not a participant in the crime; or 13 (c) Uses or threatens the use of a dangerous 14 15 instrument; or (d) Displays what is or appears to be a knife, pistol 16 17 revolver, rifle, shotgun, machine gun, or other firearm. (2) Burglary/home invasion is a felony punishable by a term 18 19 of not more than thirty (30) years. 20 SECTION 2. Section 97-17-23, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 21 amended as follows: 97-17-23. Except as provided by Section 1 of this act, every 2.2 person who shall be convicted of breaking and entering the 23 24 dwelling house or inner door of such dwelling house of another, 25 whether armed with a deadly weapon or not, and whether there shall 26 be at the time some human being in such dwelling house or not, with intent to commit some crime therein, shall be punished by 27

30 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 31 and after July 1, 1999.
