HOUSE BILL NO. 866

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 27-19-56.12, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 2 1972, TO REQUIRE DISTINCTIVE MOTOR VEHICLE LICENSE PLATES ISSUED 3 TO UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES VETERANS TO INDICATE IN BOLD AND 4 DISTINCTIVE WORDS THE PARTICULAR WAR OR MILITARY CONFLICT IN WHICH 5 THE VETERAN SERVED; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 SECTION 1. Section 27-19-56.12, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 amended as follows:

27-19-56.12. (1) In recognition of the patriotic service 9 rendered by Mississippians who are honorably discharged veterans 10 who served in the United States Armed Forces in Saudi Arabia or 11 Kuwait during Operation Desert Storm or Operation Desert Shield, 12 13 in Panama during the invasion, in Grenada during the invasion, 14 during the Vietnam Conflict, during the Korean Conflict, during World War II or during World War I, any such person is privileged 15 to obtain one (1) distinctive motor vehicle license plate or tag 16 identifying him as a veteran, and indicating, in bold and 17 distinctive words, the veteran's service in the above enumerated 18 wars or conflicts. The distinctive plates or tags shall be of a 19 20 color and design designated by the Tax Commission.

21 (2) The distinctive license plates shall be prepared by the 22 Tax Commission and shall be issued through the tax collectors of 23 the counties in the same manner as are other motor vehicle license 24 plates or tags. An additional tag fee of Thirty Dollars (\$30.00) 25 shall be collected by the tax collector for such license plates or 26 tags and shall be forwarded to the Tax Commission which shall 27 deposit such fee to the credit of a fund to be administered by the

H. B. No. 866 99\HR03\R1139 PAGE 1 28 board overseeing the veterans nursing homes in this state for the 29 benefit of indigent veterans who are residents of such nursing 30 homes.

(3) An applicant for such distinctive plates shall present 31 32 to the issuing official written evidence of the veteran's service. 33 Such evidence shall include a copy of the applicant's DD-214 form or an equivalent document. The distinctive license plates or tags 34 35 so issued shall be used only upon a personally or jointly owned private passenger vehicle (to include station wagons, recreational 36 motor vehicles and pickup trucks) registered in the name, or 37 jointly in the name, of the person making application therefor, 38 and when issued to such person shall be used upon the vehicle for 39 40 which issued in lieu of the standard license plate or license tag normally issued for such vehicle. 41

42 (4) The distinctive license plates shall not be transferable 43 between motor vehicle owners; and in the event the owner of a 44 vehicle bearing a distinctive plate shall sell, trade, exchange or 45 otherwise dispose of the vehicle, such plate shall be retained by 46 such owner and returned to the tax collector.

47 (5) The changes in the license tag design and wording required by the amendments to this section by House Bill No. 48 1999 Regular Session, shall be applicable only to license tags 49 issued under this section from and after July 1, 1999; however, 50 any person who, on July 1, 1999, possesses a valid distinctive 51 52 license tag issued under this section before July 1, 1999, may 53 apply with the county tax collector and may be issued a 54 replacement distinctive license tag under this section without payment of any additional fee. Such replacement license tag shall 55 have the same expiration date as the tag which it replaces. 56 57 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 1999. 58

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
