> COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 973

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO 1 2 IMPLEMENT A PILOT PROGRAM TO ASSIST IN THE ESTABLISHMENT OF FAMILY 3 SUPPORT CENTERS AND PARENT EDUCATION PROGRAMS; TO PROVIDE THAT THE GOAL OF FAMILY SUPPORT CENTERS AND PARENT EDUCATION PROGRAMS SHALL 4 5 BE TO CREATE A BETTER LIFE FOR MISSISSIPPI FAMILIES AND CHILDREN; TO SPECIFY CERTAIN PROGRAMS TO BE MADE AVAILABLE THROUGH FAMILY SUPPORT CENTERS; TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT TO ESTABLISH AN 6 7 8 APPLICATION PROCESS FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE PILOT PROGRAM; TO 9 REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT TO GIVE PRIORITY TO APPLICANTS FROM LEVELS 10 I AND II SCHOOL DISTRICTS; TO REQUIRE APPLICANTS TO HAVE IN PLACE AN ADVISORY BOARD FOR THE FAMILY SUPPORT CENTER; TO AUTHORIZE THE DEPARTMENT TO USE AVAILABLE FUNDING FOR GRANTS TO PARTICIPATING 11 12 FAMILY SUPPORT CENTERS; TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT TO APPOINT AN 13 14 ADVISORY COMMITTEE TO ASSIST THE DEPARTMENT IN PROMULGATING 15 REGULATIONS FOR THE PILOT PROGRAM; TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT TO 16 RECOMMEND TO THE LEGISLATURE WHETHER OR NOT THE PROGRAM SHOULD BE 17 PERMANENTLY ESTABLISHED; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 18 19 SECTION 1. (1) The State Department of Education, in its 20 discretion, may develop and implement a pilot program to assist in the establishment of community-based family support centers and 21 22 individual family or parent education services. The goal of the programs shall be to create a better life for families and 23 children in Mississippi, with emphasis being placed on the 24 emotional, physical, social and mental needs of the whole family. 25 26 The family support centers and family or parent education service 27 programs shall provide parents with opportunities to voluntarily obtain support and services that will enable them to provide 28 29 optimum learning environments for their children, particularly from birth to the age of three (3) years, within the home. 30 The family support centers shall serve to build community networks to 31 support children and families through the implementation of the 32 following care activities: parenting classes; developmental 33

No. 973 99\HR07\R447CS PAGE 1 34 programs for prekindergarten-age children during parent education 35 classes; support groups; individual family or parent education 36 services; a resource library; and resource and referral services. 37 Additional services may be provided to meet the identified family 38 needs of the community and in keeping with the goals of the 39 program. The family support centers shall focus on school 40 readiness and early literacy.

(2) Under the pilot program, the department shall establish 41 a procedure for interested school districts and other nonprofit 42 entities in partnership with a school district to apply for 43 44 assistance in establishing a family support center. In selecting school districts and nonprofit entities for the program, the 45 46 department shall give priority to applicants that are school districts having Level I or II accreditation or other entities 47 situated within school districts accredited at Level I or II. At 48 least one (1) family support center shall be established in each 49 50 congressional district.

(3) Under the pilot program, the department shall establish 51 a procedure for interested school districts and other nonprofit 52 53 entities in partnership with a school district to apply for 54 individual family or parent education programs. Programs must use research based, independently evaluated, proven research models 55 that are documented to have a positive impact on reducing special 56 57 education placements, development of language and social skills, 58 and parental involvement in schools.

As part of the application process for participation in 59 (4) 60 the pilot program, applicants must demonstrate to the department that the family support center is a collaborative undertaking of 61 62 various community organizations. Each applicant must have created 63 an advisory board for the family support center or parent education services programs, involving the participation of the 64 65 local school district or districts, the city and county governing authorities, the county health department, regional mental health 66 centers, the extension service, representatives of the Department 67 68 of Human Services and any other private or public entities 69 participating in the partnership.

70 (5) The State Department of Education may accept any funds,

The funds shall be used to award grants to the 73 participating family support centers or family or parent education 74 services programs for the support of such programs. A family 75 support center or family or parent education services program may 76 use any available funding to support the administration and 77 programs of the center or education services program.

78 (6) The State Department of Education shall promulgate 79 rules and regulations necessary for the proper administration of 80 this section. An advisory group shall be established to assist in the development of the rules and regulations for administration of 81 82 the program. Members of the advisory group shall include, but not be limited to, representatives of the following categories: 83 parents; local school districts' parent education programs staff; 84 the Department of Human Services, Division of Family and 85 86 Children's Services; Head Start; the cooperative extension 87 services; and USOE funded parental assistance programs.

88 (7) If the family support center and family or parent 89 education services pilot programs authorized by this section are 90 implemented, the State Department of Education shall report to the 91 Legislature, within three (3) years after the pilot program's 92 implementation, on the desirability of expanding and permanently 93 establishing the program.

94 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 95 and after July 1, 1999.

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
