HOUSE BILL NO. 994

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-3-35, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 PROVIDE THAT THE ANNUAL SALARIES OF THE FULL-TIME DISTRICT 3 ATTORNEYS SHALL BE EQUAL TO THE ANNUAL SALARIES OF THE CIRCUIT COURT JUDGES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Section 25-3-35, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows: 25-3-35. (1) The annual salaries of the following judges 8 are fixed as follows, to begin at the commencement of the next 9 10 term of office immediately succeeding the existing term: Chief Justice of the Supreme Court..... \$100,900.00 11 12 Associate Justices of the Supreme Court, each..... 98,300.00 13 However, in addition to their present official duties, there 14 15 are imposed upon the Supreme Court Justices the extra duties of making a special study of existing laws and reporting to each 16 17 regular session of the Legislature such constructive suggestions as they may deem necessary for the improvement of the 18 administration of justice, and of advising and counseling with the 19 20 State Librarian in the selection of law books for purchase and use in the State Law Library, advising with the librarian thereof upon 21 22 the removal from the library of any books which may be the least frequently used, and for the placing of same in a convenient 23 24 location so as to provide additional space for such books and 25 other current publications which may be more frequently used or 26 called for. For such extra services each justice, from and after July 1, 1997, shall receive a sum sufficient when added to the 27

99\HR03\R1554 PAGE 1 29 Nine Hundred Dollars (\$100,900.00) for the Chief Justice, 30 Ninety-eight Thousand Nine Hundred Dollars (\$98,900.00) for the 31 Presiding Justice, and Ninety-eight Thousand Three Hundred Dollars (\$98,300.00) for Associate Justices, per annum. 32 As each existing 33 term expires and the above-captioned salaries become effective in due course, the extra duties and compensation provided for shall 34 35 cease. The annual salaries of the judges of the Court of 36 (2) 37 Appeals of Mississippi are fixed as follows: Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals..... \$94,300.00 38 Associate Judges of the Court of Appeals 39 40 41 (3) The annual salaries of the chancery and circuit court judges are fixed as follows: 42 43 Chancery Judges, each..... \$88,700.00 44 45 In addition to their present official duties, there are 46 imposed upon the chancery and circuit court judges the extra duties of making a special study of existing laws relating to 47 48 trial courts and reporting to the Supreme Court of the State of 49 Mississippi such constructive suggestions as they may deem 50 necessary for the improvement of the administration of justice, which shall be recommended to the Legislature by the Supreme Court 51 in the manner provided by law. The judges shall advise and 52 53 supervise in the purchase of law books for the libraries of each district, and shall study and evaluate the inventory of books and 54 55 facilities now existing in the libraries of each district to effect the removal and relocation of obsolete publications so as 56 to provide additional space for those books and current 57 58 publications more frequently used. The judges shall study the 59 existing rules promulgated by the circuit and chancery court 60 judicial associations governing the operation of chancery and circuit courts, and revise the same pursuant to existing laws. 61 62 For such extra services each judge, from and after July 1, 1997, 63 shall receive a sum sufficient when added to the present salaries 64 of the judges to aggregate Eighty-eight Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars (\$88,700.00) per annum for each judge. become effective in due course, and the extra duties andcompensation provided for shall cease.

69 (4) The Supreme Court shall prepare a payroll for chancery
70 judges and circuit judges and submit such payroll to the
71 Department of Finance and Administration.

72 (5) The annual <u>salaries</u> of the full-time district attorneys
73 shall be <u>an amount equal to the annual salaries of the circuit</u>
74 <u>court judges</u>.

75 (6) The annual salary of the full-time legal assistants 76 shall be not less than Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) nor 77 more than Sixty-seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$67,500.00), 78 as established by the district attorney.

SECTION 2. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi is directed to submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor, or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the Attorney General of the United States or to the United States District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 86 and after July 1, 1999, it if is effectuated on or before that 87 date under Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended 88 89 and extended. If it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended, after July 1, 1999, 90 this act shall take effect and be in force from and after the date 91 92 it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 93 1965, as amended and extended.
