HOUSE BILL NO. 1058

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-3-35, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 INCREASE THE SALARIES OF CIRCUIT JUDGES AND CHANCELLORS; AND FOR 3 RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 25-3-35, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

7 25-3-35. (1) The annual salaries of the following judges are fixed as follows, to begin at the commencement of the next 8 9 term of office immediately succeeding the existing term: 10 Chief Justice of the Supreme Court..... \$100,900.00 11 12 Associate Justices of the Supreme Court, each..... 98,300.00 13 However, in addition to their present official duties, there are imposed upon the Supreme Court Justices the extra duties of 14 making a special study of existing laws and reporting to each 15 regular session of the Legislature such constructive suggestions 16 17 as they may deem necessary for the improvement of the administration of justice, and of advising and counseling with the 18 State Librarian in the selection of law books for purchase and use 19 20 in the State Law Library, advising with the librarian thereof upon the removal from the library of any books which may be the least 21 22 frequently used, and for the placing of same in a convenient location so as to provide additional space for such books and 23 other current publications which may be more frequently used or 24 25 called for. For such extra services each justice, from and after July 1, 1997, shall receive a sum sufficient when added to the 26 27 present salaries of the justices to aggregate One Hundred Thousand

No. 1058 99\HR03\R1579 PAGE 1 28 Nine Hundred Dollars (\$100,900.00) for the Chief Justice, 29 Ninety-eight Thousand Nine Hundred Dollars (\$98,900.00) for the 30 Presiding Justice, and Ninety-eight Thousand Three Hundred Dollars (\$98,300.00) for Associate Justices, per annum. 31 As each existing 32 term expires and the above-captioned salaries become effective in due course, the extra duties and compensation provided for shall 33 34 cease. The annual salaries of the judges of the Court of 35 (2) Appeals of Mississippi are fixed as follows: 36 37 Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals..... \$94,300.00 Associate Judges of the Court of Appeals 38 39 40 (3) The annual salaries of the chancery and circuit court judges are fixed as follows: 41 42 Chancery Judges, each..... \$<u>96,200.00</u> 43 44 In addition to their present official duties, there are 45 imposed upon the chancery and circuit court judges the extra duties of making a special study of existing laws relating to 46 47 trial courts and reporting to the Supreme Court of the State of Mississippi such constructive suggestions as they may deem 48 49 necessary for the improvement of the administration of justice, 50 which shall be recommended to the Legislature by the Supreme Court in the manner provided by law. The judges shall advise and 51 52 supervise in the purchase of law books for the libraries of each district, and shall study and evaluate the inventory of books and 53 54 facilities now existing in the libraries of each district to 55 effect the removal and relocation of obsolete publications so as to provide additional space for those books and current 56 57 publications more frequently used. The judges shall study the existing rules promulgated by the circuit and chancery court 58 59 judicial associations governing the operation of chancery and circuit courts, and revise the same pursuant to existing laws. 60 61 For such extra services each judge, from and after the effective 62 date of House Bill No. , 1999 Regular Session, shall receive a 63 sum sufficient when added to the present salaries of the judges to 64 aggregate Ninety-six Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$96,200.00) per 65 annum for each judge. the above-captioned salaries become effective in due course, andthe extra duties and compensation provided for shall cease.

(4) The Supreme Court shall prepare a payroll for chancery
judges and circuit judges and submit such payroll to the
Department of Finance and Administration.

(5) The annual salary of the full-time district attorneys
shall be Seventy-nine Thousand Eight Hundred Thirty Dollars
(\$79,830.00).

(6) The annual salary of the full-time legal assistants
shall be not less than Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) nor
more than Sixty-seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$67,500.00),
as established by the district attorney.

SECTION 2. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor, or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the Attorney General of the United States or to the United States District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 85 86 and after July 1, 1999, if it is effectuated on or before that date under Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended 87 and extended. If it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting 88 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended, after July 1, 1999, 89 this act shall take effect and be in force from and after the date 90 91 it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 92 1965, as amended and extended.
