HOUSE BILL NO. 1060

1	AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE PAYMENT OF DEATH BENEFITS TO THE
2	SURVIVORS OF LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER KILLED IN THE LINE OF DUTY;
3	TO CREATE THE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS DEATH BENEFITS FUND; TO
4	PROVIDE FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE FUND BY THE DEPARTMENT OF
5	PUBLIC SAFETY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 7 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) Whenever used in this section, the term:
- 8 (a) "Employer" means a state board, commission,
- 9 department, division, bureau, or agency, or a county, municipality
- 10 or other political subdivision of the state, which employs,
- 11 appoints or otherwise engages the services of law enforcement
- 12 officers.
- 13 (b) "Law enforcement officer" means any lawfully sworn
- 14 officer or employee of the state or any political subdivision of
- 15 the state whose duties require the officer or employee to
- 16 investigate, pursue, apprehend, arrest, transport or maintain
- 17 custody of persons who are charged with, suspected of committing,
- 18 or convicted of a crime.
- 19 (2) (a) The sum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars
- 20 (\$100,000.00) shall be paid as provided in this section when a law
- 21 enforcement officer, while engaged in the performance of the
- 22 officer's law enforcement duties, is accidentally or intentionally
- 23 killed or receives accidental or intentional bodily injury that
- 24 results in the loss of the officer's life, provided that the
- 25 killing is not the result of suicide and that the bodily injury is
- 26 not intentionally self-inflicted.
- 27 (b) The payment provided for under paragraph (a) of

- 28 this subsection shall be made to the beneficiary that was
- 29 designated in writing by the law enforcement officer, signed by
- 30 the officer and delivered to the employer during the officer's
- 31 lifetime. If no such designation is made, then the payment shall
- 32 be made to the officer's surviving child or children and spouse in
- 33 equal portions, and if there is no surviving child or spouse, then
- 34 to the officer's parent or parents. If a beneficiary is not
- 35 designated and there is no surviving child, spouse or parent, then
- 36 the payment shall be made to the officer's estate.
- 37 (c) The payment made under paragraph (a) of this
- 38 subsection is in addition to any workers' compensation or pension
- 39 benefits and is exempt from the claims and demands of creditors of
- 40 the law enforcement officer.
- 41 (3) There is established in the State Treasury a special
- 42 fund to be known as the Law Enforcement Officers Death Benefits
- 43 Fund, which shall be funded by an initial appropriation of Eight
- 44 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$800,000.00). The Legislature shall
- 45 make such additional appropriations as needed to maintain a
- 46 minimum balance of Eight Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$800,000.00) in
- 47 the fund. Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the end of
- 48 the state fiscal year shall not lapse into the State General Fund,
- 49 and any interest earned on amounts in the fund shall be deposited
- 50 to the credit of the fund.
- 51 (4) The Department of Public Safety shall be responsible for
- 52 the management of the death benefits fund and the disbursement of
- 53 death benefits authorized under this section. The Department of
- 54 Public Safety shall adopt rules and regulations necessary to
- 55 implement and standardize the payment of death benefits under this
- 56 section, to administer the death benefits fund created by this act
- 57 and to carry out the purposes of this section.
- SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 59 and after July 1, 1999.
