HOUSE BILL NO. 1067 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO REQUIRE THAT CERTAIN INSURANCE POLICIES AND PLANS OFFER MEDICAL BENEFITS WHEN DENTAL CARE IS PROVIDED UNDER 1 2 3 PHYSICIAN-SUPERVISED GENERAL ANESTHESIA; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. Every hospital, health or medical expenses б insurance policy, hospital or medical service contract, health 7 maintenance organization and preferred provider organization that is delivered or issued for delivery in this state and otherwise 8 9 provides anesthesia benefits shall offer benefits for anesthesia and for associated facility charges when the mental or physical 10 condition of the child or mentally handicapped adult requires 11 12 dental treatment to be rendered under physician-supervised general 13 anesthesia in a hospital setting, surgical center or dental office. This coverage shall be offered on an optional basis, and 14 15 each primary insured must accept or reject such coverage in writing and accept responsibility for premium payment. 16

An insurer may require prior authorization for the anesthesia 17 and associated facility charges for dental care procedures in the 18 same manner that prior authorization is required for treatment of 19 20 other medical conditions under general anesthesia. An insurer may require review for medical necessity and may limit payment of 21 22 facility charges to certified facilities in the same manner that medical review is required and payment of facility charges is 23 limited for other services. The benefit provided by this coverage 24 shall be subject to the same annual deductibles or coinsurance 25 established for all other covered benefits within a given policy, 26 27 plan or contract. Private third party payers may not reduce or

A dentist shall consider the Indications for General Anesthesia as published in the reference manual of the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry as utilization standards for determining whether performing dental procedures necessary to treat the particular condition or conditions of the patient under general anesthesia constitutes appropriate treatment.

The provisions of this section shall apply to anesthesia services provided by oral and maxillofacial surgeons as permitted by the Mississippi State Board of Dental Examiners.

38 The provisions of this section shall not apply to treatment 39 rendered for temporal mandibular joint (TMJ) disorders.

40 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 41 and after July 1, 1999.
