HOUSE BILL NO. 1094

1 2 3	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 97-17-39 AND 97-29-25, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT THE CRIME OF DESECRATION OF A CEMETERY SHALL BE A FELONY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. Section 97-17-39, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
6	amended as follows:
7	97-17-39. If any person, by any means whatever, shall
8	wilfully or mischievously injure or destroy any of the burial
9	vaults, urns, memorials, vases, foundations, bases or other
10	similar items in a cemetery, or injure or destroy any of the work,
11	materials, or furniture of any courthouse or jail, or other public
12	building, or schoolhouse or church, or deface any of the walls or
13	other parts thereof, or shall write, or make any drawings or
14	character, or do any other act, either on or in said building or
15	the walls thereof, or shall deface or injure the trees, fences,
16	pavements, or soil, on the grounds belonging thereto, or an
17	ornamental or shade tree on any public road or street leading
18	thereto, such person, upon conviction, for such offense, shall be
19	punished as follows:
20	(a) If the damage caused by the destruction or
21	defacement of such property has a value of less than Three Hundred

Dollars (\$300.00), any person who is convicted of such offense

shall be fined not more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) or

be imprisoned in the county jail for not more than one (1) year,

- 32 Dollars (\$5,000.00) or be imprisoned in the State Penitentiary for
- 33 up to five (5) years, or both.
- 34 SECTION 2. Section 97-29-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 35 amended as follows:
- 36 97-29-25. Every person who shall knowingly and willfully dig
- 37 up, except as otherwise provided by law, obliterate, or in any way
- 38 desecrate any cemetery where human dead are interred, or cause
- 39 through word, deed or action the same to happen, shall be guilty
- 40 of a felony and shall upon conviction be imprisoned for not more
- 41 than <u>five (5)</u> year<u>s</u> in the <u>State Penitentiary</u> or fined not more
- 42 than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) or both, in the discretion
- 43 of the court. In addition to any penalties that the court is
- 44 otherwise authorized to impose the court may, in its discretion,
- 45 order such restitution as it deems appropriate.
- In construing this section, a cemetery shall mean any plot of
- 47 ground (1) on which are grave markers of stone, wood, metal or any
- 48 other material recognizable as marking graves, or (2) the
- 49 boundaries of which are defined by a recorded plat, a fence line
- 50 or corner markers, or trees, or are defined in any other
- 51 discernible manner.
- 52 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 53 and after July 1, 1999.
