HOUSE BILL NO. 1148

- 1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-15-46, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO CLARIFY THAT THE OYSTER SHELL RETENTION FEE SHALL BE COLLECTED
- 3 FROM THE CATCHER; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 49-15-46, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 6 amended as follows:
- 7 49-15-46. (1) Each in-state vessel used to catch, take,
- 8 carry or transport oysters from the reefs of the State of
- 9 Mississippi, or engaged in transporting any oysters in any of the
- 10 waters within the territorial jurisdiction of the State of
- Mississippi, for commercial use, shall annually, before beginning 11
- 12 operations, be licensed by the commission and pay the following
- 13 license fee:
- Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) on all vessels or boats 14
- 15 utilized for tonging oysters; or
- (b) One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) on all vessels or 16
- 17 boats utilized for dredging oysters.
- Each out-of-state vessel used to catch, take, carry or 18
- transport oysters from the reefs of the State of Mississippi, or 19
- 20 engaged in transporting any oysters in any of the waters within
- the territorial jurisdiction of the State of Mississippi, for 2.1
- commercial use, must annually, before beginning operations, be 22
- licensed by the commission and pay the following license fee: 23
- (a) One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) on all vessels or 24
- 25 boats utilized for tonging oysters; or
- (b) Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) on all vessels or 26

- 27 boats utilized for dredging oysters.
- 28 (3) All oysters harvested in the State of Mississippi shall
- 29 be tagged. Tags shall be issued by the department and shall bear
- 30 the catcher's name, the date and origin of the catch, the shell
- 31 stock dealer's name and permit number. The department shall
- 32 number all tags issued and shall maintain a record of those tags.
- 33 (4) Each person catching or taking oysters from the waters
- 34 of the State of Mississippi for personal use shall obtain a permit
- 35 from the commission and pay an annual recreational oyster permit
- 36 fee of Ten Dollars (\$10.00). Oysters caught under a recreational
- 37 permit shall not be offered for sale. The limits on the allowable
- 38 catch of oysters for recreational purposes shall be three (3)
- 39 sacks per week. The department shall issue tags of a
- 40 distinguishing color to designate recreationally harvested
- 41 oysters, which shall be tagged on the same day of harvest in the
- 42 manner prescribed in subsection (3) of this section for
- 43 commercially harvested oysters.
- 44 (5) The commission shall assess and collect <u>from the catcher</u>
- 45 a fee of Fifty Cents (50¢) per sack for the shells taken from
- 46 waters within the territorial jurisdiction of the State of
- 47 Mississippi, but processed in other states, in lieu of taking
- 48 delivery of those shells. Funds received from the shell retention
- 49 fee shall be paid into a special fund in the State Treasury to be
- 50 appropriated by the Legislature for use by the commission to
- 51 further oyster production in this state.
- 52 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 53 and after July 1, 1999.
