HOUSE BILL NO. 1180

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-13-131, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE FOR THE TEACHING OF ABSTINENCE AS A METHOD OF BIRTH CONTROL IN THE COMPREHENSIVE SCHOOL HEALTH EDUCATION PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

6 SECTION 1. Section 37-13-131, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows:

8 37-13-131. (1) The State Department of Education is 9 designated as the state agency responsible for the administration 10 and supervision of the Comprehensive School Health Education Program as an educational curriculum in the State of Mississippi. 11 12 It is the intent of the Legislature that all funds made available to the State Department of Education for the purpose of 13 comprehensive school health education shall be administered by the 14 15 State Department of Education.

(2) Pursuant to the provisions of subsection (1) of this 16 17 section, the State Department of Education is authorized to establish an Office of Comprehensive School Health Education 18 within the framework of the State Department of Education for the 19 20 purpose of developing standards, procedures and criteria for the administration and supervision of a statewide program of health 21 22 education in Kindergarten through Grade 12. The State Department of Education, through the Office of Comprehensive School Health 23 24 Education, shall assume the further responsibility for promoting a 25 statewide effort designed to prepare local school faculties and 26 staffs to incorporate the comprehensive health education concept 27 into their local educational programs.

No. 1180 99\HR40\R1085 PAGE 1 28 (3) The Mississippi Department of Health, in conjunction 29 with the Office of Student Development-Branch of Health-Related Services of the State Department of Education, shall develop a 30 31 long-range strategic plan for a Comprehensive School Health 32 Education Program in Grades K through 12. The Comprehensive School Health Education Program shall encompass four (4) 33 interdependent components: (a) health education; (b) health 34 service; (c) physical education and fitness; and (d) a healthful 35 36 school environment. These curriculum components shall be designed 37 to develop decision-making competencies related to health and 38 health behavior. Such curriculum components are intended to 39 motivate health maintenance and promote wellness, not only to prevent disease or disability. The Mississippi Department of 40 41 Health, in conjunction with the Office of Student Development-Branch of Health-Related Services of the Department of 42 43 Education, shall develop the strategic plan and make a report thereon to the Governor and the Legislature on or before January 44 1, 1995. 45 (4) The Mississippi Department of Health, in conjunction 46 47 with the Office of Student Development-Branch of Health-Related Services of the State Department of Education, shall develop a 48 curriculum which provides for the teaching of abstinence as a 49
