## HOUSE BILL NO. 1184

- AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT IF AN ELECTED OFFICIAL CHANGES 1 POLITICAL PARTIES DURING HIS TERM OF OFFICE, HE SHALL RESIGN HIS 3 OFFICE AND THE OFFICE SHALL BE DECLARED VACANT, UNLESS THE CHANGE OCCURS WITHIN SIX MONTHS OF A REGULAR ELECTION TO FILL THAT 5 OFFICE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 7 <u>SECTION 1.</u> If an elected official registers with a political party, during his term of office, that is a different political 9 party from the political party to which he paid qualifying fees as a candidate for the office he currently holds, then the elected 10 official shall resign his office and the office to which he was 11 elected shall be declared vacant immediately by the Secretary of 12 13 State or by the proper election commission, and the office shall 14 be filled by special election or as otherwise provided by law. Registering with a different political party for reelection to the 15 office the official currently holds or for election to another 16 office shall not render an office vacant if a regular election 17 will be held to fill the office he currently holds within six (6) 18 months of the candidate changing political parties. 19 SECTION 2. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi 20 21 shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor, or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the 22 23 Attorney General of the United States or to the United States District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the 2.4 provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and 25 extended. 26
