HOUSE BILL NO. 1190

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 17-17-407, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO EXTEND THE EFFECTIVE DATE ON THE PROHIBITION ON LANDFILLING TIRES FROM JANUARY 1, 2000, UNTIL JANUARY 1, 2001; AND FOR RELATED 2 3 4 PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 6 SECTION 1. Section 17-17-407, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows: 17-17-407. The commission may promulgate and enforce rules 8 and regulations pertaining to collection, transportation, storage, 9 10 processing and disposal of waste tires and may modify, repeal, make exceptions to and grant exemptions and variances from the 11 12 rules and regulations. The rules and regulations shall include: 13 (a) Methods of collection, storage, processing and disposal of waste tires. The following are permissible methods of 14 15 waste tire processing and disposal: (i) Controlling soil erosion, when whole tires are 16 17 not used; (ii) Grinding into crumbs for use in road asphalt, 18 19 tire derived fuel and as raw materials for other products; 20 (iii) Pyrolizing or other physico-chemical 21 processing; 2.2 (iv) Incineration; (v) Landfilling split, ground, chopped, sliced or 23 24 shredded waste tires until January 1, 2001. Beginning January 1, 25 2001, the landfilling of waste tires in any form, including, but 26 not limited to, split, ground, chopped, sliced, shredded or whole waste tires is prohibited, unless the commission grants an 27

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In determining whether to grant an exception, the 28 exception. 29 commission shall consider the following factors: A. whether sufficient end-use or recycling markets have developed in all or 30 parts of the state, B. whether the condition of the waste tire or 31 32 waste tire derived material prevents recycling, C. whether the 33 prohibition on landfilling waste tires will place a financial burden on local governments, or D. other factors the commission 34 35 deems relevant. It is the intent of the Legislature that the commission shall, to the extent practicable, grant exceptions in 36 areas of the state where the prohibition against landfilling waste 37 tires will pose a demonstrated, unfunded financial burden on local 38 39 governments.

40 (vi) Other methods as approved by the commission.
41 (b) Procedures for authorization or permitting for
42 waste tire collection sites, waste tire processing facilities,
43 waste tire haulers and waste tire disposal sites, including a
44 review of the applicant's performance history;

(c) Requirements for location of facilities at which waste tires are collected, stored, processed or disposed, with regards to property boundaries and buildings, pest control, accessibility by fire fighting equipment and other considerations as they relate to protection of public health and safety and the environment; and

(d) Requirements for any financial assurance for waste
tire haulers, waste tire collection sites, waste tire processing
facilities and waste tire disposal facilities.

54 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 55 and after July 1, 1999.

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
