HOUSE BILL NO. 1286

1 AN ACT TO PROHIBIT CONSERVATION OFFICERS FROM LEASING LAND TO 2 HUNTING CLUBS WHILE SERVING IN THE OFFICIAL CAPACITY OF A 3 CONSERVATION OFFICER; TO AMEND SECTIONS 49-1-13 AND 49-1-43, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, IN CONFORMITY THERETO; AND FOR RELATED 4 PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF 5 б MISSISSIPPI: 7 8 SECTION 1. Conservation officers of the Department of 9 Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks are prohibited from leasing or negotiating the leasing of privately owned land to hunting clubs 10 at any time while they are serving in their capacity as 11 12 conservation officers. SECTION 2. Section 49-1-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 13 14 amended as follows: 15 49-1-13. The director is hereby authorized and directed to appoint as many conservation officers as may be required to 16 efficiently enforce the laws for the protection of wild animals, 17 birds and fish, and the laws relating to theft of cattle, trespass 18 prohibitions and litter. These officers shall be located in 19 different sections of the state where their services are most 20 needed. Conservation officers shall police the state lands in 21 22 their respective districts and prohibit the unlawful cutting of timber. The salary of the conservation officers shall be as 23 24 determined by the State Personnel Board, or its successor. 25 Each conservation officer and supervisor shall be furnished an allowance for uniforms not to exceed the amount specified in 26 the appropriation bill. 27 Conservation officers are prohibited from leasing or 28

31 SECTION 3 Section 49-1-43, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 32 amended as follows:

49-1-43. (1) The director shall have general supervision
and control of all conservation officers, and shall enforce all
the laws and regulations of the state relating to wild animals,
birds and fish, and shall exercise all necessary powers incident
thereto not specifically conferred on the department.

38 (2) The director, with the approval of the commission, shall
39 make to the Governor and the Legislature a report covering the
40 operation of the department for the preceding fiscal year.

(3) It shall be the duty of all conservation officers to
enforce, and to obey and carry out all instructions and directions
of the department with respect to the enforcement of the laws and
regulations relating to wild animals, birds and fish.

45 (4) The director and each conservation officer shall have
46 power, and it shall be the duty of the director and of each
47 conservation officer:

48 (a) To execute all warrants and search warrants for a
49 violation of the laws and regulations relating to wild animals,
50 birds and fish and to serve subpoenas issued for the examination
51 and investigation or trial of offenses against any of the laws or
52 regulations;

To search where the conservation officer has cause 53 (b) 54 to believe and does believe that animals, birds or fish, or any 55 parts thereof, or the nest or eggs of birds, or spawn or eggs of fish are possessed in violation of law or regulation and in such 56 case to examine, without warrant, the contents of any boat, car, 57 automobile or other vehicle, box, locker, basket, creel, crate, 58 59 game bag or other package, to ascertain whether any law or 60 regulation for the protection of animals, birds or fish have been or are being violated, and to use such force as may be necessary 61

(c) With a search warrant to search and examine the contents of any dwelling house, room, building or premises of any person suspected of violating any law or regulation, to seize all animals, birds or fish, or parts thereof, or nests or eggs of birds taken in violation of law or regulation, or showing evidence of illegal taking and to seize and confiscate all devices illegally used in taking animals, birds or fish;

(d) To arrest, without warrant, any person committing or attempting to commit a misdemeanor, felony or a breach of the peace within his presence or view and to pursue and so arrest any person committing an offense in any place in the state where the person may go or be; to aid and assist any peace officer of this state or any other state if requested, in manhunts or natural disasters within the state; and

(e) To exercise other powers of peace officers in the enforcement of game laws or regulations or of a judgment for the violation thereof, as are not herein specifically provided.

80 (5) In all cases of arrest without warrant, the person
81 making such arrest must inform the accused of the object and cause
82 of the arrest, except when he is in the actual commission of the
83 offense or is arrested on pursuit.

84 (6) No conservation officer shall compromise or settle out
85 of court any violation of this chapter, or any law or regulation
86 for the protection of wild animals, birds or fish.

87 (7) Nothing in this section shall be construed as granting88 conservation officers general police powers.

89 (8) Citations issued by a conservation officer for any 90 violation of the laws for the protection of wild animals, birds 91 and fish, the trespass laws, the litter laws, and the boating laws 92 shall be issued on a uniform citation form consisting of an 93 original and at least two (2) copies. Such citation shall show, 94 among other necessary information, the name of the issuing

No. 1286 99\HR03\R1563 PAGE 3 95 officer, the name of the court in which the cause is to be heard, 96 and the date and time the person charged with a violation is to 97 appear to answer the charge. The uniform citation form shall make 98 a provision on it for information that will constitute a complaint 99 charging the offense for which the citation was issued and, when 100 duly sworn to and filed with a court of competent jurisdiction, 101 prosecution may proceed under that complaint.

102 Conservation officers are prohibited from leasing or negotiating the lease of privately owned land to hunting clubs as 103 104 provided in Section 1 of this act. The director shall remove from 105 office any conservation officer found to have violated the provisions of Section 1 of this act, and any such officer may not 106 107 again be a candidate for service as an employee of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks in any capacity. 108 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from 109

110 and after July 1, 1999.
