HOUSE BILL NO. 1293

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 9-11-27, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO ESTABLISH A MINIMUM SALARY TO BE PAID TO THE JUSTICE COURT CLERKS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 9-11-27, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

8 9-11-27. The board of supervisors of each county \* \* \*, at 9 its own expense, shall appoint one (1) person to serve as clerk of 10 the justice court system of the county, and may appoint such other employees for the justice court of the county as it deems 11 necessary, including a person or persons to serve as deputy clerk 12 13 or deputy clerks. The board of supervisors of each county with 14 two (2) judicial districts \* \* \*, at its own expense, <u>may</u> appoint two (2) persons to serve as clerks of the justice court system of 15 16 the county, one (1) for each judicial district, and may appoint such other employees for the justice court system of the county as 17 it deems necessary including persons to serve as deputy clerks. 18 The clerk and deputy clerks shall be empowered to file and record 19 actions and pleadings, to receive and receipt for monies, to 20 acknowledge affidavits, to issue warrants in criminal cases upon 21 22 direction by a justice court judge in the county, to approve the sufficiency of bonds in civil and criminal cases, to certify and 23 issue copies of all records, documents and pleadings filed in the 24 justice court and to issue all process necessary for the operation 25 of the justice court. The clerk or deputy clerks may refuse to 26 27 accept a personal check in payment of any fine or cost or to

All orders from the justice court judge to the clerk of 29 30 the justice court shall be written. All cases, civil and criminal, shall be assigned by the clerk to the justice court 31 judges of the county in the manner provided in Section 11-9-105 32 and Section 99-33-2. Each justice court clerk shall receive as 33 34 full compensation for his services an annual salary of not less than Twenty-four Thousand Dollars (\$24,000.00). The salary shall 35 36 be payable by warrant drawn by the clerk of the board of supervisors on the general fund of the county. 37 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 38

39 and after October 1, 1999.
