7	SECTION 1. Section 9-7-123, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
8	amended as follows:
9	9-7-123. $(1)$ The clerk of the circuit court shall have
10	power, with the approbation of the court, or of the judge in
11	vacation, to appoint one or more deputies, who shall take the oath
12	of office and may give bond, and who thereupon shall have power to
13	do and perform all the acts and duties which their principal may
14	lawfully do; such approval, when given by the judge in vacation,
15	shall be in writing, and shall be entered on the minutes of the
16	court at the next term.
17	(2) Each deputy clerk of the circuit court, before he enters
18	upon the duties of the appointment, shall take the oath of office,
19	and may give bond, with sufficient surety, to be payable,
20	conditioned and approved as provided by law, in a penalty equal to
21	three percent (3%) of the sum of all the state and county taxes
22	shown by the assessment rolls and the levies to have been
