HOUSE BILL NO. 1314

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 73-43-3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO
PROVIDE THAT THE MISSISSIPPI OSTEOPATHIC MEDICAL ASSOCIATION SHALL
MAKE NOMINATIONS TO THE GOVERNOR FOR MEMBERS APPOINTED TO THE
STATE BOARD OF MEDICAL LICENSURE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 73-43-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

73-43-3. (1) The State Board of Medical Licensure shall 8 9 consist of nine (9) physicians. Each of the physicians shall have 10 graduated from a medical school which has been accredited by the Liaison Committee on Medical Education as sponsored by the 11 American Medical Association and the Association of American 12 13 Medical Colleges or from an osteopathic medical school which has been accredited by the Bureau of Professional Education of the 14 15 American Osteopathic Association, and have at least six (6) years' experience in the practice of medicine. No more than two (2) 16 17 members of the board shall be a member of the faculty of the University of Mississippi School of Medicine. No more than four 18 19 (4) members of the board shall be from the same Mississippi 20 Supreme Court district.

(2) Three (3) physicians shall be nominated to the Governor
for each appointive position by the Mississippi State Medical
Association; one (1) physician shall be nominated to the Governor
for each appointive position by the Mississippi Osteopathic
Medical Association; and all said nominations shall give due
regard to geographic distribution, race and sex. The Governor
shall appoint from said nominations the members of the board with

the advice and consent of the Senate. The original appointments 28 29 of the board shall be made no later than June 30, 1980, for terms to begin on July 1, 1980. The Governor shall designate the 30 initial terms of the members as follows: Three (3) members shall 31 32 be appointed for a term which expires July 1, 1982, three (3) 33 members shall be appointed for a term which expires July 1, 1984, and three (3) members shall be appointed for a term which expires 34 July 1, 1986. Thereafter, all succeeding appointments shall be 35 for terms of six (6) years from the expiration of the previous 36 term. Vacancies in office shall be filled by appointment of the 37 Governor in the same manner as the appointment to the position 38 which becomes vacant, including the submission of nominations by 39 both the Mississippi State Medical Association and the Mississippi 40 Osteopathic Medical Association, subject to the advice and consent 41 of the Senate at the next regular session of the Legislature. 42 43 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 44 and after July 1, 1999.
