HOUSE BILL NO. 1350

3 4	AN ACT TO CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI CIVIL RIGHTS MONUMENT COMMISSION FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING THE MISSISSIPPI CIVIL RIGHTS MONUMENT; TO PROVIDE FOR THE COMPOSITION, POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE MISSISSIPPI CIVIL RIGHTS MONUMENT COMMISSION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSE.
6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
7	SECTION 1. (1) There is created the Mississippi Civil
8	Rights Monument Commission ("commission"). The commission shall

consist of five (5) members as follows: two (2) members shall be

appointed by the Governor, two (2) members shall be appointed by

- 11 the Lieutenant Governor, and one (1) member shall be appointed by the Attorney General. Members of the commission shall serve 12
- staggered terms as follows: one (1) member appointed by the
- 15 the Governor for a term of two (2) years, one (1) member appointed

Governor for a term of one (1) year, one (1) member appointed by

- by the Lieutenant Governor for a term of three (3) years, one (1) 16
- member appointed by the Lieutenant Governor for a term of four (4) 17
- years, and the member appointed by the Attorney General for a term 18
- of five (5) years. After the terms of the initial members expire, 19
- successors shall be chosen by the appropriate appointing authority 20
- 21 and shall serve for terms of five (5) years.
- 22 The initial meeting of the commission shall be called
- and chaired by the member appointed by the Attorney General, until 23
- the commission chooses a chairman from among its members. 2.4
- Thereafter, the commission shall elect a chairman and secretary 25
- each year, and the commission may meet at the call of the chairman 26
- once each month. Minutes of the meetings of the commission shall 27

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- 28 be kept and, along with all other records and papers, shall remain
- 29 in the custody of the secretary of the commission. A majority of
- 30 the commission shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of
- 31 business. All actions taken or rules and regulations adopted by
- 32 the commission shall be by resolution duly spread upon its
- 33 minutes, showing yea and nay votes of each member present. The
- 34 signature of the chairman and secretary, pursuant to a duly
- 35 adopted resolution, shall be binding upon the commission.
- 36 (3) The members of the commission shall receive per diem
- 37 compensation in the amount authorized under Section 25-3-69 for
- 38 each day or portion thereof spent in the performance of the duties
- 39 of the commission and shall be entitled to reimbursement for
- 40 travel expenses while on commission business as authorized under
- 41 Section 25-3-41. Commission members shall be limited to
- 42 reimbursement of travel expenses and per diem compensation
- 43 authorized herein for no more than twelve (12) meetings per year.
- 44 (4) The commission shall have continuing oversight
- 45 responsibility over all activities pertaining to the Mississippi
- 46 Civil Rights Monument.
- 47 (5) The commission shall continue in existence under the
- 48 provisions of this act after the design, construction and
- 49 dedication of the Mississippi Civil Rights Monument for a period
- of one (1) year after the date on which the monument is officially
- 51 dedicated.
- 52 (6) When the commission ceases to exist, all records of the
- 53 commission shall become the property of the Mississippi Department
- 54 of Archives and History.
- 55 <u>SECTION 2.</u> The commission shall cause to be constructed and
- 56 maintained the Mississippi Civil Rights Monument when adequate
- 57 funds for the construction thereof are deposited in the
- 58 Mississippi Civil Rights Monument Trust Fund herein created. Such
- 59 monument shall be in honor of persons who have contributed to the
- 60 advancement of civil rights in Mississippi and the United States.
- 61 <u>SECTION 3.</u> The commission shall:
- 62 (a) Plan and provide for the design, construction and
- 63 dedication of the Mississippi Civil Rights Monument to be located
- on the grounds of the State Capitol. The actual design and site

- of the monument shall be selected with the approval of the
- 66 Mississippi Department of Archives and History.
- (b) Solicit private monetary donations for deposit into
- 68 the Mississippi Civil Rights Monument Trust Fund. The commission
- 69 also may solicit public funds, including appropriations from the
- 70 Legislature, for deposit into the Mississippi Civil Rights
- 71 Monument Trust Fund.
- 72 (c) Report to the Legislature by November 15 of each
- 73 year on the progress of such monument. In addition to such
- 74 report, the commission shall submit an annual report on its
- 75 activities no later than November of each year to the Public
- 76 Buildings, Grounds and Lands Committee of the Mississippi House of
- 77 Representatives and the Public Property Committee of the
- 78 Mississippi Senate.
- 79 <u>SECTION 4.</u> The commission may accept gifts, grants and
- 80 donations from individuals, businesses, organizations,
- 81 corporations, associations and other legal entities, as well as
- 82 the State of Mississippi and any agency, department, institution,
- 83 instrumentality or political subdivision thereof, to be deposited
- 84 in the Mississippi Civil Rights Monument Trust Fund which is
- 85 created in the State Treasury. The State Treasurer shall invest
- 86 all monies in the Mississippi Civil Rights Monument Trust Fund and
- 87 any interest earned shall be deposited into the fund. All funds
- 88 deposited in the Mississippi Civil Rights Monument Trust Fund
- 89 shall be used exclusively for the purpose of designing,
- 90 constructing and maintaining the Mississippi Civil Rights
- 91 Monument. Any monies remaining unexpended or unencumbered in the
- 92 fund upon completion of the monument shall revert to the
- 93 Mississippi Department of Archives and History for maintenance of
- 94 the Mississippi Civil Rights Monument.
- 95 SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 96 and after July 1, 1999.
