HOUSE BILL NO. 1361

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 73-11-51, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO REQUIRE THE REGISTRATION OF SELLERS OF PRENEED FUNERAL 3 SERVICES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 73-11-51, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

7 73-11-51. (1) No person shall engage in the business or 8 practice of funeral service, including embalming, and/or funeral 9 directing or hold himself out as transacting or practicing or 10 being entitled to transact or practice funeral service, including 11 embalming, and/or funeral directing in this state unless duly 12 licensed pursuant to the provisions of this chapter.

13 (2) The board is authorized and empowered to examine 14 applicants for licenses for the practice of funeral service and 15 funeral directing and shall issue the proper license to those 16 persons who successfully pass the applicable examination and 17 otherwise comply with the provisions of this chapter.

(3) To be licensed for the practice of funeral directing 18 under this chapter, a person must (a) be at least eighteen (18) 19 20 years of age; (b) have a high school diploma or the equivalent 21 thereof; (c) have served as a resident trainee for not less than 22 twenty-four (24) months under the supervision of a person licensed for the practice of funeral service or funeral directing in this 23 state; (d) have successfully passed a written and/or oral 24 25 examination as prepared or approved by the board; and (e) be of 26 good moral character.

27 (4) To be licensed for the practice of funeral service under

No. 1361 99\HR03\R1181 PAGE 1 28 this chapter, a person must (a) be at least eighteen (18) years of 29 age; (b) have a high school diploma or the equivalent thereof; (c) 30 have satisfactorily completed twelve (12) months or more of academic and professional instruction from an institution 31 32 accredited by the American Board of Funeral Service Education or 33 any other successor recognized by the United States Department of 34 Education for funeral service education; (d) have served as a resident trainee for not less than twelve (12) months, either 35 36 prior to or after graduation from an accredited institution 37 mentioned above, under the supervision of a person licensed for the practice of funeral service in this state or having the prior 38 39 equivalent license of this state; (e) have successfully passed a written and/or oral examination as prepared or approved by the 40 board; and (f) be of good moral character. 41

(5) All applications for examination and license for the 42 43 practice of funeral service or funeral directing shall be upon 44 forms furnished by the board and shall be accompanied by an examination fee, a licensing fee and a nonrefundable application 45 46 fee in amounts fixed by the board in accordance with Section 47 73-11-56. The fee for an initial license, however, may be prorated in proportion to the period of time from the date of 48 issuance to the date of biennial license renewal prescribed in 49 50 subsection (8) of this section. All applications for examination 51 shall be filed with the board office at least sixty (60) days prior to date of examination. A candidate shall be deemed to have 52 53 abandoned the application for examination if he does not appear on 54 the scheduled date of examination unless such failure to appear 55 has been approved by the board.

The practice of funeral service or funeral directing 56 (6) 57 must be engaged in at a licensed funeral establishment, at least 58 one (1) of which is listed as the licensee's place of business; 59 and no person, partnership, corporation, association or other 60 organization shall open or maintain a funeral establishment at 61 which to engage in or conduct or hold himself or itself out as H. 62 engaging in the practice of funeral service or funeral directing 63 until such establishment has complied with the licensing 64 requirements of this chapter. A license for the practice of funeral service or funeral directing shall be used only at 65 66 licensed funeral establishments; however, this provision shall not 67 prevent a person licensed for the practice of funeral service or 68 funeral directing from conducting a funeral service at a church, a residence, public hall, lodge room or cemetery chapel, if such 69 70 person maintains a fixed licensed funeral establishment of his own 71 or is in the employ of or an agent of a licensed funeral establishment. 72

73 (7) Any person holding a valid, unrevoked and unexpired 74 license in another state or territory having requirements 75 substantially similar to those of this state may apply for a license to practice in this state by filing with the board a 76 77 certified statement from the secretary of the licensing board of 78 the state or territory in which the applicant holds his license certifying to his qualifications and good standing with that board 79 80 by having successfully passed a written and/or oral examination on the Mississippi Funeral Service licensing law and rules and 81 82 regulations as prepared or approved by the board, and by paying a nonrefundable application fee set by the board pursuant to Section 83 84 73-11-56. If the board finds that the applicant has fulfilled 85 substantially similar requirements, the board shall grant such license upon receipt of a fee in an amount equal to the renewal 86 87 fee set by the board for a license for the practice of funeral 88 service or funeral directing, as the case may be, in this state. 89 The board may issue a temporary funeral service or funeral directing work permit before a license is granted, prior to the 90 91 next regular meeting of the board, if the applicant for a 92 reciprocal license has complied with all requirements, rules and 93 regulations of the board. The temporary permit will expire at the 94 next regular meeting of the board.

95 (8) (a) Any person holding a license for the practice of H. B. No. 1361 99\HR03\R1181 PAGE 3

96 funeral service or funeral directing may have the same renewed for 97 a period of two (2) years by making and filing with the board an 98 application therefor within thirty (30) days preceding the expiration of his license on forms provided by the board and upon 99 100 payment of a renewal fee in an amount set by the board in accordance with Section 73-11-56. The board shall mail a notice 101 102 of the due date for payment of the renewal fee to the last known 103 address of each licensee at least thirty (30) days prior to such 104 date.

105 (b) If the renewal fee is not paid on or before the date that it is due, a late fee, as prescribed by Section 106 107 73-11-56, in addition to the regular renewal fee, shall be required. A period of thirty (30) days shall be allowed after the 108 expiration of a license, during which time the license may be 109 renewed on the payment of the renewal fee plus the applicable late 110 111 fee. If a person fails to renew his license during the aforesaid 112 thirty-day period, the license of such person shall by operation of law automatically expire and become void without further action 113 114 of the board. The board may reinstate such license if application for licensure is made within a period of five (5) years, upon 115 116 payment of the renewal fee for the current year, all fees in arrears, late fees and a reinstatement fee as set by the board. 117 118 After such five-year period, the license may be reinstated only by 119 payment of the renewal fee for the current year, all renewal fees 120 in arrears, late fees plus a reinstatement fee and by the licensee 121 successfully passing a written and/or oral examination as prepared 122 or approved by the board.

(c) The expiration date of each license issued or 123 124 renewed shall be established by rules and regulations of the 125 board. Subject to the provisions of this subsection, each license 126 shall be renewable in a biennial basis upon filing of a renewal application and upon payment of the renewal fee established 127 128 pursuant to Section 73-11-56. To provide for a system of biennial 129 renewal of licenses, the board may provide by rules and H. B. No. 1361 99\HR03\R1181 PAGE 4

130 regulations that licenses issued or renewed for the first time after July 1, 1994, may expire less than two (2) years from the 131 132 date of issuance or renewal. In each case in which a license is issued or renewed for a period of time less than two (2) years, 133 134 the board shall prorate to the nearest whole month the license or renewal fee established pursuant to Section 73-11-56. 135 The provisions of this paragraph (c) shall not apply to the resident 136 137 trainee certificate or period of resident traineeship under 138 Section 73-11-53.

139 (9) Any person holding on July 1, 1984, a license to practice embalming shall be entitled to a license for either of 140 141 the named licenses upon meeting the same terms and conditions as are herein provided for the renewal of licenses of those who may 142 be licensed after July 1, 1984. Any person in this state engaged 143 144 in the practice of funeral directing on July 1, 1984, either as an 145 owner of a funeral establishment or an employee thereof, who has 146 had experience as a funeral director for at least two (2) years within the five (5) years immediately preceding July 1, 1984, 147 148 shall be entitled to a license for funeral directing upon meeting the same terms and conditions as are herein provided for the 149 150 renewal of licenses for the practice of funeral directing. 151 However, from and after July 1, 1991, the board shall issue 152 licenses only as provided for under the provisions of subsections 153 (3) and (4) of this section.

(10) The board may, in its discretion, in the event of a 154 155 major disaster or emergency where human death is likely to occur, temporarily authorize the practice of funeral directing and 156 157 funeral service by persons licensed to practice in another state 158 but not licensed to practice in this state, provided that such 159 services are only rendered by members of disaster mortuary teams 160 authorized by federal or appropriate local authorities to provide 161 such services. Only persons licensed in this state, however, may 162 sign death certificates.

163 (11) Each application or filing made under this section

164 shall include the Social Security number(s) of the applicant in 165 accordance with Section 93-11-64, Mississippi Code of 1972.

166 (12) All sellers of preneed funeral services shall register

167 with the board and pay a registration fee of Twenty-five Dollars

168 (\$25.00) every two (2) years to be eligible to conduct business in

169 the State of Mississippi. Any person, firm, corporation or other

170 entity who does not register and pay the registration fee shall be

171 guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be fined One

172 Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00). All registered sellers of preneed

173 funeral services must have a contract with a licensed funeral

174 establishment at a specified price in order to provide such

175 services and copies of such contracts shall be provided to the

176 board. For the purposes of this subsection, "preneed funeral

177 services" means a contract or agreement for the arrangement for

178 the disposition of dead human bodies, including, but not limited

179 to, the sale of caskets, vaults, clothing, urns and any necessary

180 services related thereto.

181 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 182 and after July 1, 1999.
