## HOUSE BILL NO. 1390

- AN ACT TO PROVIDE AN ALLOTMENT OF FUNDS UNDER THE MINIMUM EDUCATION PROGRAM TO THE 50 SCHOOL DISTRICTS HAVING THE HIGHEST 3 INCIDENCES OF CRIME AND VIOLENCE FOR THE PURPOSE OF EMPLOYING SOCIAL WORKERS; TO DIRECT THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO DETERMINE WHICH SCHOOL DISTRICTS SHALL RECEIVE SUCH ALLOTMENTS; TO 5
- 6 REQUIRE SOCIAL WORKERS EMPLOYED WITH SUCH FUNDS TO BE
- 7 APPROPRIATELY LICENSED; TO AUTHORIZE THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF
- EDUCATION TO PROMULGATE RULES AND REGULATIONS CONCERNING THE 8
- ACTIVITIES OF SUCH SOCIAL WORKERS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- SECTION 1. (1) Beginning with the 1999-2000 school year, 11
- the State Department of Education shall allot sufficient funding 12
- under the minimum education program to those school districts 13
- designated pursuant to subsection (2) of this section for the 14
- 15 purpose of employing a social worker.
- 16 (2) The State Department of Education shall designate fifty
- 17 (50) school districts to receive an allotment for the purpose of
- employing a social worker. The districts shall be selected by the 18
- department according to greatest need, as indicated by records of 19
- the State Department of Education and the Division of Youth 20
- Services of the Department of Human Services which reflect those 21
- school districts having the highest incidences of crime and 2.2
- 23 violence.
- The State Department of Education may increase the 2.4
- 25 number of social worker positions funded each year beyond the
- above requirements as money is made available. 26
- 27 (4) Any individual employed by a school district with funds
- allotted pursuant to this section must be appropriately licensed 28
- as a social worker under Sections 73-53-1 through 73-53-29. The 29

- 30 State Department of Education shall specify which license a social
- 31 worker must hold as a qualification to being employed in a
- 32 position funded under this section.
- 33 (5) To qualify for minimum program funding, school social
- 34 workers must be full-time professional personnel and must spend at
- 35 least seventy-five percent (75%) of their work time in a direct
- 36 relationship with students. School social workers may not devote
- 37 more than twenty-five percent (25%) of the work day to
- 38 administrative activities related to their social work.
- 39 (6) Nothing in this section shall prohibit a school district
- 40 from employing social workers with local funds.
- 41 (7) The State Department of Education may adopt rules and
- 42 regulations regarding the activities of the school social workers.
- 43 School social workers may perform those services that are not
- 44 inconsistent with such rules and regulations.
- 45 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 46 and after July 1, 1999.
