HOUSE BILL NO. 1393

AN ACT TO CREATE AND EMPOWER THE MISSISSIPPI COMMISSION ON 1 2 THE ECONOMIC STATUS OF WOMEN; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT 3 ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 5 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1)(a) There is created the Mississippi 6 Commission on the Economic Status of Women. The commission shall 7 be composed of eleven (11) members to be appointed as follows: (i) Six (6) members shall be appointed by the 8 9 Governor; and 10 (ii) Five (5) members shall be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor. 11 (b) The members of the commission shall be women and 12 men of recognized ability and achievement who are representative 13 of the ethnic and cultural diversity of the population of this 14 15 state. Members shall serve for terms of four (4) years each, and no member may serve for more than two (2) consecutive terms. All 16 17 vacancies shall be filled by the appointing authority for the unexpired term. 18 The commission shall elect a chairman, vice 19 (C) 20 chairman and secretary from among its members for terms of two (2) years each, and any member is eligible for successive elections to 21 2.2 office. A quorum for transacting business shall be a 23 (d) 24 majority of the members of the commission. 25 (e) Members of the commission shall be reimbursed for 26 expenses as provided in Section 25-3-41, and shall receive per diem as provided in Section 25-3-69. 27

after he has made his appointments, and the Governor shall then
designate a place and time for the initial, organizational meeting
of the commission.

35 (a) To employ such administrative, technical and other
36 personnel as may be necessary for the performance of its powers

(iii) The development of individual potential; 62 63 (iv) State laws in regard to the civil, economic and political rights of women, including pensions, tax 64 requirements, property rights, marriage and dissolution of 65 66 marriage provisions, and similar matters; 67 (v) The effect of social attitudes and pressures and economic considerations in shaping the roles to be assumed by 68 69 women in the society; and 70 (vi) Any laws, practices or conditions concerning or affecting women which impose special limitations or burdens 71 72 upon them or upon society, or which limit or tend to limit 73 economic opportunities available to women. 74 The commission shall act as an information center (b) on the economic status of women and women's educational, 75 76 employment and other related needs. 77 The commission shall recommend, develop, prepare or (C) coordinate materials, projects or other activities and shall give 78 79 technical and consultative advice to public or private groups or persons concerned with any of the following: 80 81 (i) Preventing or minimizing problems brought about by the changing roles and responsibilities of women; and 82 83 (ii) Developing programs to encourage and enable 84 women to be fully contributing members of society. 85 (d) The commission may encourage women's organizations 86 and other groups to institute local self-help activities designed 87 to meet women's educational, employment and related needs. 88 (4) The commission shall make a report to the Legislature at the close of each fiscal year on its activities, findings and 89 90 recommendations. 91 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 92 and after July 1, 1999.

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
