## HOUSE BILL NO. 1434

AN ACT TO CODIFY SECTION 73-39-43, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 2 TO AUTHORIZE THE MISSISSIPPI BOARD OF VETERINARY MEDICINE TO 3 CERTIFY ANIMAL CONTROL AGENCIES TO UTILIZE CERTAIN CONTROLLED 4 SUBSTANCES FOR THE HUMANE DESTRUCTION OF ANIMALS AND TO CERTIFY 5 AND PRESCRIBE QUALIFICATIONS FOR CERTIFIED ANIMAL EUTHANASIA TECHNICIANS (CAET) TO PERFORM EUTHANASIA OF ANIMALS; TO AMEND 6 7 SECTION 73-39-9, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE THE MISSISSIPPI BOARD OF VETERINARY MEDICINE TO ADOPT RULES IN 8 9 CONFORMITY THERETO; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. The following provision shall be codified as Section 73-39-43, Mississippi Code of 1972:

13 <u>73-39-43.</u> (1) For purposes of this section, the following 14 terms shall have the meaning ascribed herein, unless the context 15 shall indicate otherwise:

(a) "Certified animal control agency" means a county or
municipal animal shelter, dog pound, or animal control agency,
private humane society, state, county or municipal law enforcement
agency, or any combination thereof, which temporarily houses
stray, unwanted or injured animals and which is certified pursuant
to the provisions of this section.

(b) "Certified animal euthanasia technician (CAET)"
means a person employed by a certified animal control agency who
is authorized by the Mississippi Board of Veterinary Medicine for
such use.

26 (c) "Board" means the Mississippi Board of Veterinary27 Medicine.

(2) The Mississippi Board of Veterinary Medicine, uponsubmission of a complete application and payment of a fee

No. 1434 99\HR03\R1703 PAGE 1 30 established by the board, shall issue to any animal control agency 31 which it determines to be qualified, a certificate authorizing the agency to apply to the Federal Drug Enforcement Agency, including 32 33 any successor entity, for a restricted controlled substance registration certificate for the purchase, possession and use of 34 35 sodium pentobarbital or other drugs as authorized by the board for administration by a certified animal euthanasia technician to 36 37 euthanize injured, sick or abandoned animals.

38 (3) The Mississippi Board of Veterinary Medicine, upon 39 submission of a complete application and payment of a fee 40 established by the board, shall issue to any person who it 41 determines to be qualified, a certificate for such person to 42 function as a certified animal euthanasia technician.

Euthanasia of animals in a certified animal control 43 (4) 44 agency may only be performed by a licensed veterinarian, including a licensed animal technician employed by and functioning under the 45 direct supervision of a licensed veterinarian, or a certified 46 47 animal euthanasia technician as provided by this section. A 48 certified animal control agency which employs a certified animal 49 euthanasia technician may purchase, possess and administer sodium pentobarbital or such other drug which the board may approve for 50 51 the euthanasia of animals. Sodium pentobarbital and such other drugs approved by the board shall be the only drugs used for the 52 euthanasia of animals in a certified animal control agency. 53

54 (5) Certified animal control agencies and certified animal
55 euthanasia technicians shall be required to renew their
56 certificates at such intervals, upon such conditions and upon the
57 payment of such fees as may be established by the board.

58 SECTION 2. Section 73-39-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 59 amended as follows:

60 73-39-9. The board shall elect from their members a
61 president, vice president and secretary-treasurer. The board is
62 authorized:

(a) To adopt reasonable rules governing the practice of
veterinary medicine as are necessary to enable it to carry out and
make effective the purpose and intent of this chapter. Such rules
shall be adopted and promulgated in accordance with the provisions

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(b) To adopt rules of professional conduct appropriate to establish and maintain a high standard of integrity, skills and practice in the profession of veterinary medicine. In prescribing such rules of professional conduct, the board may be guided by the principles of veterinary medical ethics adopted by the American Veterinary Medical Association and the Mississippi Veterinary Medical Association.

75 (c) To have its rules printed which shall be76 distributed to all licensed veterinarians.

77 (d) To bring proceedings in courts for the enforcement78 of this chapter or any rules made pursuant thereto.

79 To hold at least one (1) regular meeting on the (e) third Tuesday in June each year in the City of Jackson at such 80 time and location as fixed by the board, for the purpose of 81 82 conducting examinations of applicants for license to practice 83 veterinary medicine, the election of officers and to consider any 84 other business that may properly come before the board. Other 85 meetings may be held upon the call of the president and secretary 86 of the board.

87 (f) To pass upon the qualifications of applicants for a
88 license to practice veterinary medicine in this state, or for a
89 certificate as an animal technician.

90 (g) To prescribe the subjects, character, manner, time 91 and place of holding examinations and the filing of applications 92 for examinations and to conduct the examinations.

93 (h) To issue temporary permits to practice to duly94 qualified applicants which shall be signed by the secretary.

95 (i) To provide for, regulate and require all persons 96 licensed in accordance with the provisions of this chapter to 97 renew their license annually; to require as a condition precedent 98 to such annual renewal the payment of the annual renewal fee as 99 provided herein; to issue annual renewal licenses to such persons

H. B. No. 1434 99\HR03\R1703 PAGE 3 100 and to suspend or revoke the license of such persons who fail, 101 refuse or neglect to renew same or pay such fees.

102 (j) To conduct investigations and hearings upon 103 complaints calling for discipline of a licensee or applicant for 104 license.

105 (k) To take testimony on any matter under its106 jurisdiction and any member thereof may administer oaths.

107 (1) To issue summons and subpoenas, including subpoenas 108 duces tecum, for any witness in connection with any matter within 109 the jurisdiction of the board, which shall be signed by either the 110 president or the secretary-treasurer of the board.

111 (m) To adopt such forms as it may deem necessary.

(n) To adopt rules and regulate the certification of
 animal control agencies and animal euthanasia technicians pursuant
 to Section 73-39-43, Mississippi Code of 1972.

115 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 116 and after July 1, 1999.
