HOUSE BILL NO. 1448

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 75-60-15, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO RESTORE THE FEE ASSESSED UNDER THE MISSISSIPPI PROPRIETARY 1 2 3 SCHOOL AND COLLEGE REGISTRATION LAW WHICH IS BASED ON THE 4 APPLICANT SCHOOL'S GROSS ANNUAL TUITION INCOME; AND FOR RELATED 5 PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 7 SECTION 1. Section 75-60-15, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 amended as follows: 75-60-15. (1) The initial application fee shall be Five 9 Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), which shall accompany each application 10 for certificate of registration, and the renewal fee shall be Two 11 Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00). There shall be an additional 12 13 initial fee based upon the applicant school's gross tuition income 14 collected during the first year after registration, according to the following schedule: 15 16 GROSS ANNUAL TUITION INCOME FEE 17 <u>0 - \$1,249,999.00</u>..... <u>2/10 OF 18</u> \$1,250,000.00 or above..... 1/10 of 1% 18 The additional fee shall be paid within thirty (30) days 19 after the end of the year. There shall be an additional annual 20 21 renewal fee based upon the school's gross tuition income collected during the previous license year, according to the same schedule, 22 23 which shall accompany the school's application for renewal. The additional and renewal fees are each subject to a maximum fee of 24 Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) and a minimum fee of Fifty 25 Dollars (\$50.00). 26 (2) If a renewal fee is not paid at least thirty (30) days 27

No. 1448 99\HR40\R1767 PAGE 1 28 prior to the expiration of a school's certificate of registration, in addition to the renewal fee, there shall be a delinquent fee of 29 one-tenth of one percent (1/10 of 1%) of such school's gross 30 31 tuition revenues collected during the previous registration year, with a maximum fee of Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars 32 (\$2,500.00) and a minimum fee of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00). 33 34 The reinstatement registration fee for a suspended school shall be Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00). No portion of any license fee 35 36 shall be subject to refund.

37 (3) A certificate of registration shall be issued or denied
38 within sixty (60) days after receipt of the application by the
39 commission.

(4) No new program of study shall be offered by any school 40 41 holding a certificate of registration until it is registered with and approved by the commission in accordance with procedures which 42 43 shall be established by the commission. After such course is registered in accordance with the approval procedures provided for 44 45 herein, it shall be included as a part of any renewal of a certificate of registration. Each application for the original 46 47 registration of a new course shall be accompanied by a fee of One 48 Hundred Dollars (\$100.00).

(5) A certificate of registration shall be valid only for 49 50 the school and courses for which it is issued and shall not include other schools or additional locations of a school unless 51 each such additional location: (a) offers only courses which are 52 53 identical to courses offered at the registered location; and (b) 54 is under the same ownership, management and control as that of the 55 registered location except as may be provided otherwise in this section. Such additional locations meeting such requirements 56 57 shall be identified as "annexes" on a certificate application. 58 Gross tuition revenues for the registered location and all annexes 59 shall be combined for the purpose of determining fees payable 60 under this section.

62 to the applicant, even though a certificate of registration is not
63 issued.

64 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 65 and after July 1, 1999.
