HOUSE BILL NO. 1460

- AN ACT TO CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI CHILD EQUITY TRUST FUND; TO REQUIRE THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION AND THE PUBLIC EMPLOYEES' 3 RETIREMENT SYSTEM TO IMPLEMENT THE TRUST FUND; TO REQUIRE THE CREATION OF AN EARLY CHILDHOOD NONATTENDANCE REGISTRATION 5 CERTIFICATE FOR INDIVIDUALS WHO ELECT NOT TO ENROLL IN MISSISSIPPI EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION; TO PROVIDE THAT NO PERSON SHALL BE ELIGIBLE FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE TRUST FUND UNLESS A CERTIFICATE 6 7 WAS FILED ON HIS BEHALF; TO REQUIRE THE DEPOSIT OF CERTAIN FUNDS 8 9 INTO THE TRUST FUND ON BEHALF OF EACH INDIVIDUAL WHO HAS FILED A CERTIFICATE; TO REQUIRE THAT THE FUNDS BE INVESTED BY THE 10 11 INVESTMENT SECTION OF THE PUBLIC EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM; TO REQUIRE THAT THE MONEY IN THE TRUST BE PAID OUT TO THE CHILD WHEN 12 CERTAIN CONDITIONS ARE MET; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 13 14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 15 SECTION 1. (1) There is created in the Public Employees' Retirement System a special trust fund to be known as the 16 17 "Mississippi Child Equity Trust Fund," which shall be administered 18 by the State Superintendent of Education and the Public Employees' Retirement System. The money for the fund shall come from certain 19 funds due to school districts under the Minimum Education Program. 20 21 These funds shall be transferred to and managed by the Public Employees' Retirement System. 22 (2) The State Superintendent of Education shall promulgate 23 rules and regulations for the administration of the program. 24
- 25 (3) To facilitate the administration of this act, the State
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- 26 Superintendent of Education shall develop an early childhood
- 27 nonattendance registration certificate which shall be made
- 28 available to the parent, guardian or custodian of any
- 29 kindergarten-age child at the same location that the child is
- 30 eligible to be enrolled in the Mississippi Early Childhood
- 31 Education Program. The certificate shall be designed to obtain

- 32 the following information:
- 33 (a) The name, address and date of birth of any early
- 34 childhood-age child who is eligible to enroll in the Mississippi
- 35 Early Childhood Education Program;
- 36 (b) The name and address of the parent, guardian or
- 37 custodian of the early childhood-age child;
- 38 (c) Certification that the parent, guardian or
- 39 custodian of the kindergarten-age child has elected not to enroll
- 40 the child in the Mississippi Early Childhood Education Program;
- 41 and
- (d) The signature of the parent, guardian or custodian
- 43 of the early childhood-age child and the date signed.
- 44 The State Superintendent of Education shall furnish a
- 45 sufficient number of the early childhood nonattendance
- 46 registration certificates to each school district each year when
- 47 the program is implemented.
- 48 (4) The failure of a parent, guardian or custodian of any
- 49 kindergarten-age child eligible to enroll in the Mississippi Early
- 50 Childhood Education Program to complete a kindergarten
- 51 nonattendance registration certificate shall not be unlawful;
- 52 however, failure to properly complete and submit the early
- 53 childhood nonattendance registration certificate shall prevent
- 54 funds from being transferred to the child's account for that year.
- 55 (5) Before September 16 of each year, each school district
- 56 shall submit to the State Superintendent of Education a copy of
- 57 each early childhood nonattendance registration certificate
- 58 received for the current school year. The state superintendent
- 59 shall deposit each child's pro rata part of Minimum Education
- 60 Program funds to the child's personal Child Equity Trust Fund
- 61 Account. For children not enrolling in kindergarten, the amount
- 62 shall be the statewide per capita Minimum Education Program
- 63 funding for that year. For children electing to attend first,
- 64 second and third grade classes not having assistant
- 65 teachers * * *, the amount shall be that child's per capita share
- of <u>assistant</u> teacher * * * salaries and benefits for that year.
- 67 The district shall provide classes both with and without <u>assistant</u>
- 68 teachers * * *. The district may place a child having an early

69 childhood nonattendance registration certificate in a class served by an assistant teacher * * * in order to solve scheduling 70 71 difficulties. The contribution to the child's trust fund account 72 shall not be reduced because of such placement. If extra funds 73 are needed to supplement the $\underline{assistant}$ teacher * * * salary, the 74 funds shall be taken on an equal percentage basis from the 75 salaries of all administrators in the district. Kindergarten, 76 first, second and third grade children who attend private schools 77 or are officially in home school are eligible to participate in the Mississippi Child Equity Trust Fund. A child must be a 78 79 citizen of the United States and a resident of Mississippi to 80 participate in this program. Parents, guardians or custodians of 81 private and home school children shall complete the early childhood nonattendance registration certificate in the same 82 83 manner as those attending public school. The superintendent of 84 the public school district shall furnish the forms and collect and transmit these forms to the State Superintendent of Education. 85 86 The State Superintendent of Education shall transfer the funds deposited to each child's account to the Public Employees' 87 88 Retirement System each year along with an accounting of the amount to be credited to each child's account. The retirement system 89 90 shall administer the Child Equity Trust Fund separate from other 91 funds it manages. At least once per year, the earnings of each individual account shall be credited to that account. This fund 92 93 shall be managed and audited in the same manner as funds in the 94 other accounts managed by the Public Employees' Retirement System. 95 (7) A child who has an account in the Child Equity Trust 96 Fund may claim the funds to go to college, trade school or for 97 other legitimate educational activity on or after reaching eighteen (18) years of age or graduating from high school. 98

children under eighteen (18) years of age, the funds shall be

disbursed to the parent, guardian or custodian by the Public

Employees' Retirement System upon receipt of a certificate of

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- 102 admission of the child to a legitimate educational entity. The
- 103 State Department of Education shall maintain a list of
- 104 educational entities deemed legitimate for purposes of this act.
- 105 For children over eighteen (18) years of age, all funds in an
- 106 individual's account shall be disbursed directly to the individual
- 107 upon receipt of a certificate of admission of the child to a
- 108 legitimate educational entity. Any time after the child reaches
- 109 twenty-five (25) years of age, the funds may be transferred
- 110 directly to the child without restrictions.
- 111 (8) For the purposes of this act, "early childhood
- 112 education" includes public school kindergarten and public school
- 113 first grade, second grade and third grade classes having an
- 114 <u>assistant</u> teacher * * * in addition to the regular teacher.
- 115 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 116 and after July 1, 1999.
