The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 6 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 7 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the State Department of Health for the 8 9 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000..... 10 \$ 44,988,478.00. SECTION 2. Employees who subsequently 64 receive a performance rating of "meets expectations" or above 65 during Fiscal Year 2000 shall receive the salary increase 66 effective the date of the rating.

It is the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2001 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2000 funds appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the agency's budget by the Mississippi Legislature.

Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions and procedures established by law.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

SECTION 4. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted

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164 State Department of Health may escalate any special funds and 165 positions not to exceed Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00). Such 166 escalation shall be submitted to and approved by the Department of 167 Finance and Administration in the manner consistent with the 168 escalation of federal funds.

SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 169 170 Department of Health shall have the authority to expend any special funds collected or otherwise available, notwithstanding 171 172 any restrictions in the general law or statutes earmarking said 173 funds for a particular use, that are in excess of the amounts needed for the purpose of such fund, for the purpose of providing 174 175 maternal and child health, family planning and disease control 176 services.

177 SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that with 178 the funds provided herein, the State Department of Health may 179 provide and administer without charge, Hepatitis B vaccinations to 180 Emergency Medical Services (EMS) personnel who are in need of such 181 vaccinations through job related exposure.

182 SECTION 9. In addition to all other sums heretofore appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be 183 184 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Local Governments and Rural Water 185 Systems Emergency Loan Fund, and the Local Governments and Rural 186 187 Water System Improvements Revolving Loan Fund as authorized in Chapter 521, Laws of 1995, to the State Department of Health for 188 189 the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Local Governments and 190 Rural Water Systems Improvements Board, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000..... 191\$ 14,585,860.00 192 193 SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that in

the event that there are insufficient Child Care Development Block Grant Funds, then the Department of Health shall maintain the Child Care Licensure Program at the same level that the program was in Fiscal Year 1993 using any other funds.

Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) shall come from the Department of 199 200 Human Services, Child Care Development Fund or other appropriate special funds for the purpose of child care licensure. 201 These 202 funds are to be transferred to the State Department of Health no 203 later than July 31, 1999. The State Department of Health shall 204 make a complete accounting of the uses of these funds to the 205 Department of Human Services.

It is the intention of the Legislature that the 206 SECTION 12. 207 State Department of Health shall expend not more than Fifty 208 Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) of the funds appropriated in Section 209 1 and allocated in Section 3 for providing the oil known as "Lorenzo's Oil" for the treatment of the genetic disorder 210 adrenoleukodystrophy (ALD), to children and Mississippi residents 211 212 over the age of twenty-one (21) who have the genetic disorder 213 adrenoleukodystrophy and for whom Medicaid does not reimburse the 214 cost of providing the oil. The department may also provide needed 215 pathology and biannual MRI exams.

216 SECTION 13. In addition to all other funds heretofore appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be 217 218 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money deposited in 219 the State Treasury from the Mississippi Tobacco Pilot Program as 220 authorized in the case Mike Moore Attorney General ex rel. State 221 of Mississippi v. The American Tobacco Company et al. (Chancery Court of Jackson County, Mississippi, Cause No. 94-1429) to the 222 223 State Department of Health for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000.....\$ 224 8,000,000.00. SECTION 14. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, Seven 225 226 Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$750,000.00) are provided for the 227 purpose of purchasing AIDS drugs only and not for educational 228 purposes.

SECTION 15. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon H. B. No. 1616 99\HR05\A301 PAGE 7 232 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 233 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 234 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 235 SECTION 16. This act shall take effect and be in force from 236 and after July 1, 1999.
